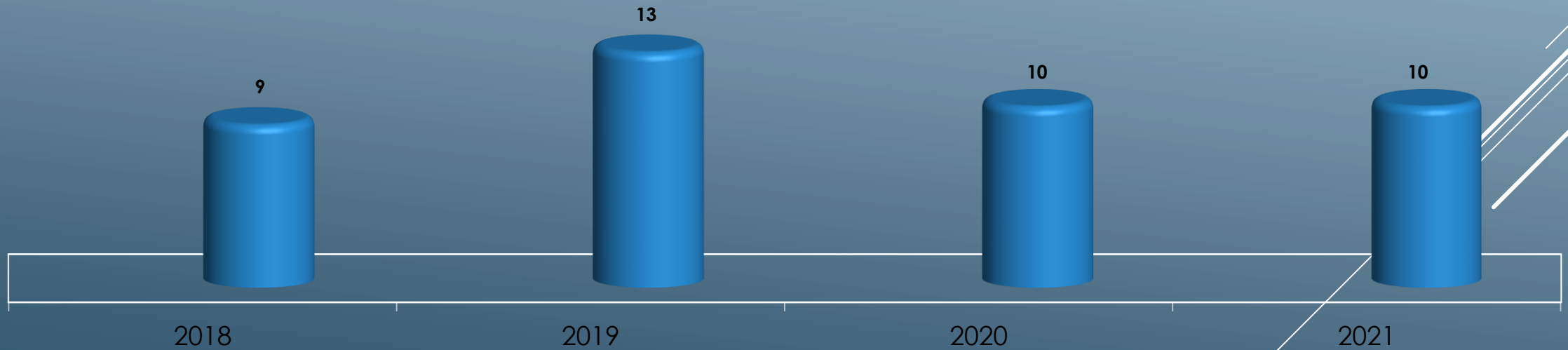
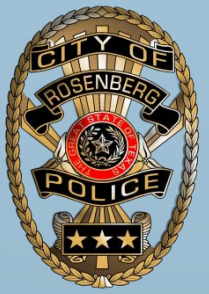
4 year comparison Property Crimes for the month of November



4 year comparison Person Crimes for the month of November



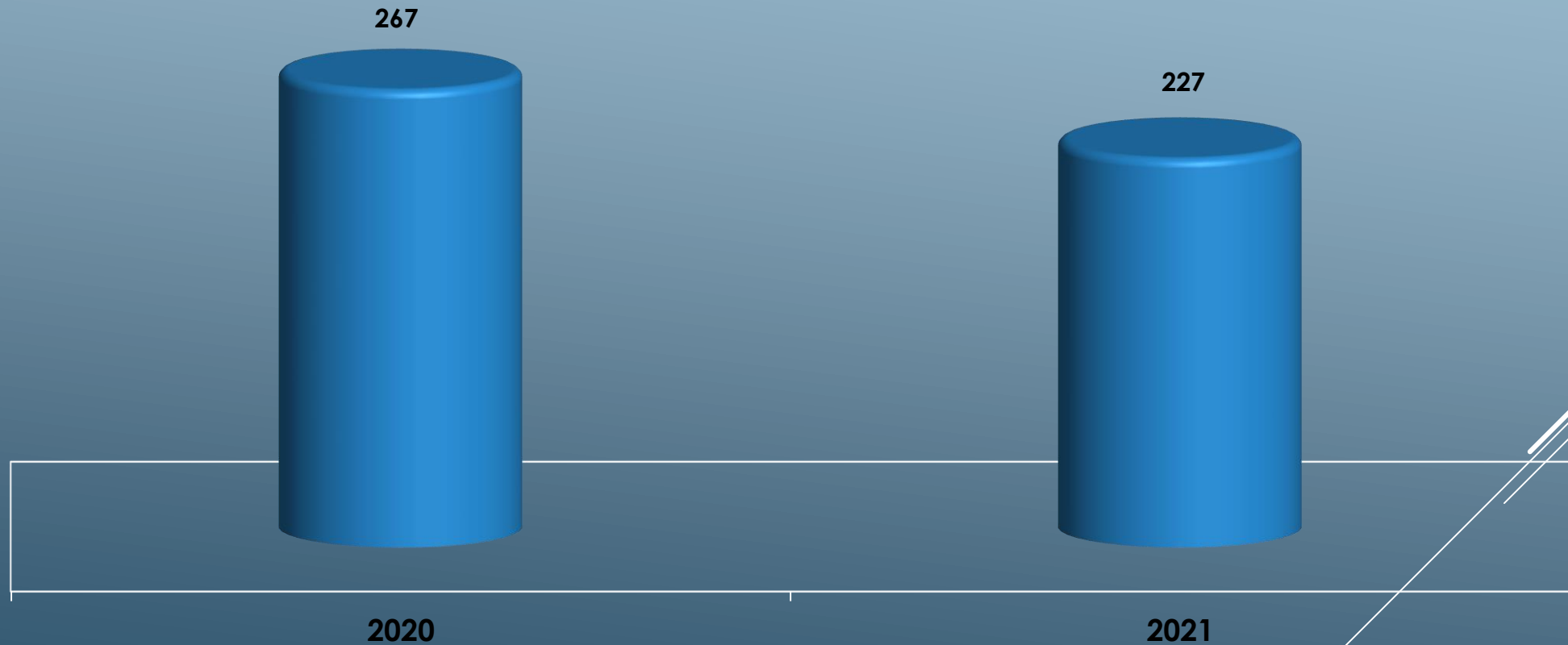
4 year comparison Violent Crimes for the month of November

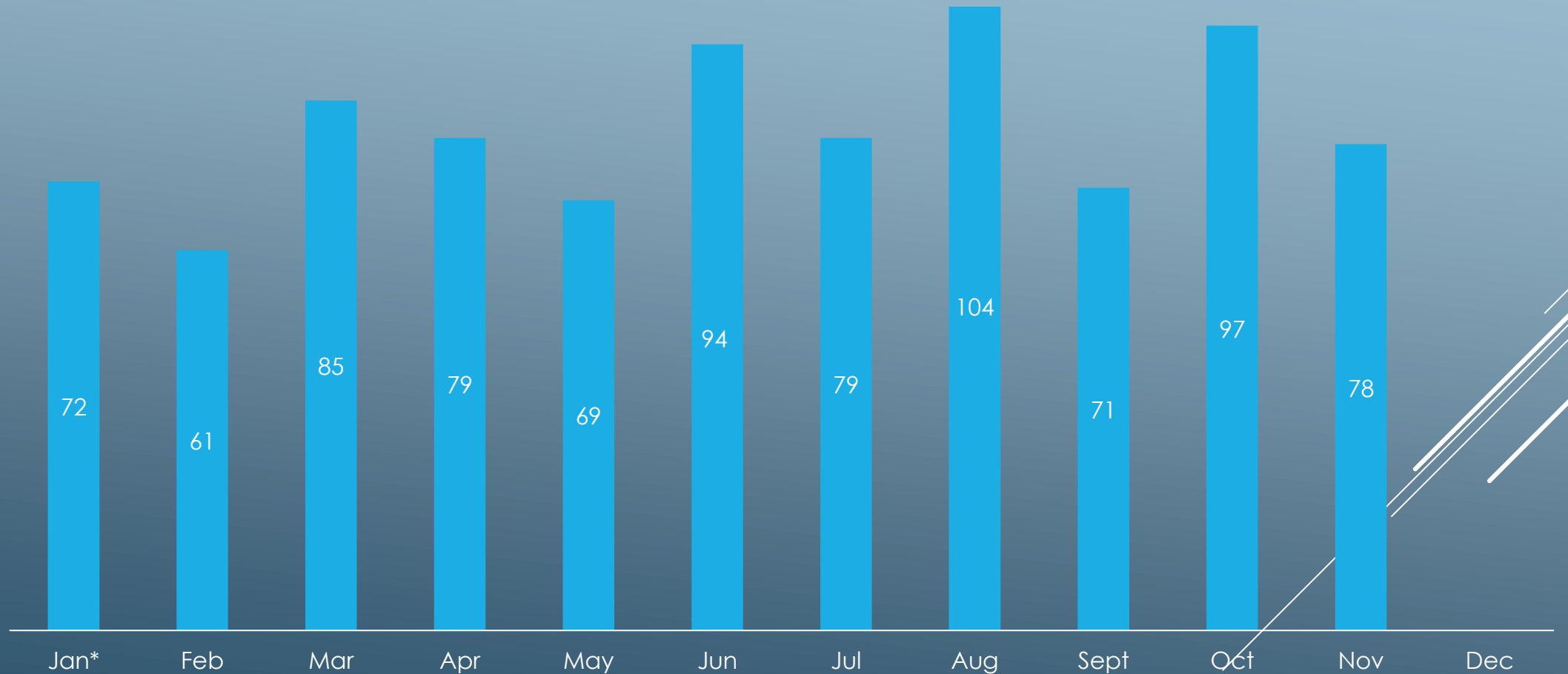

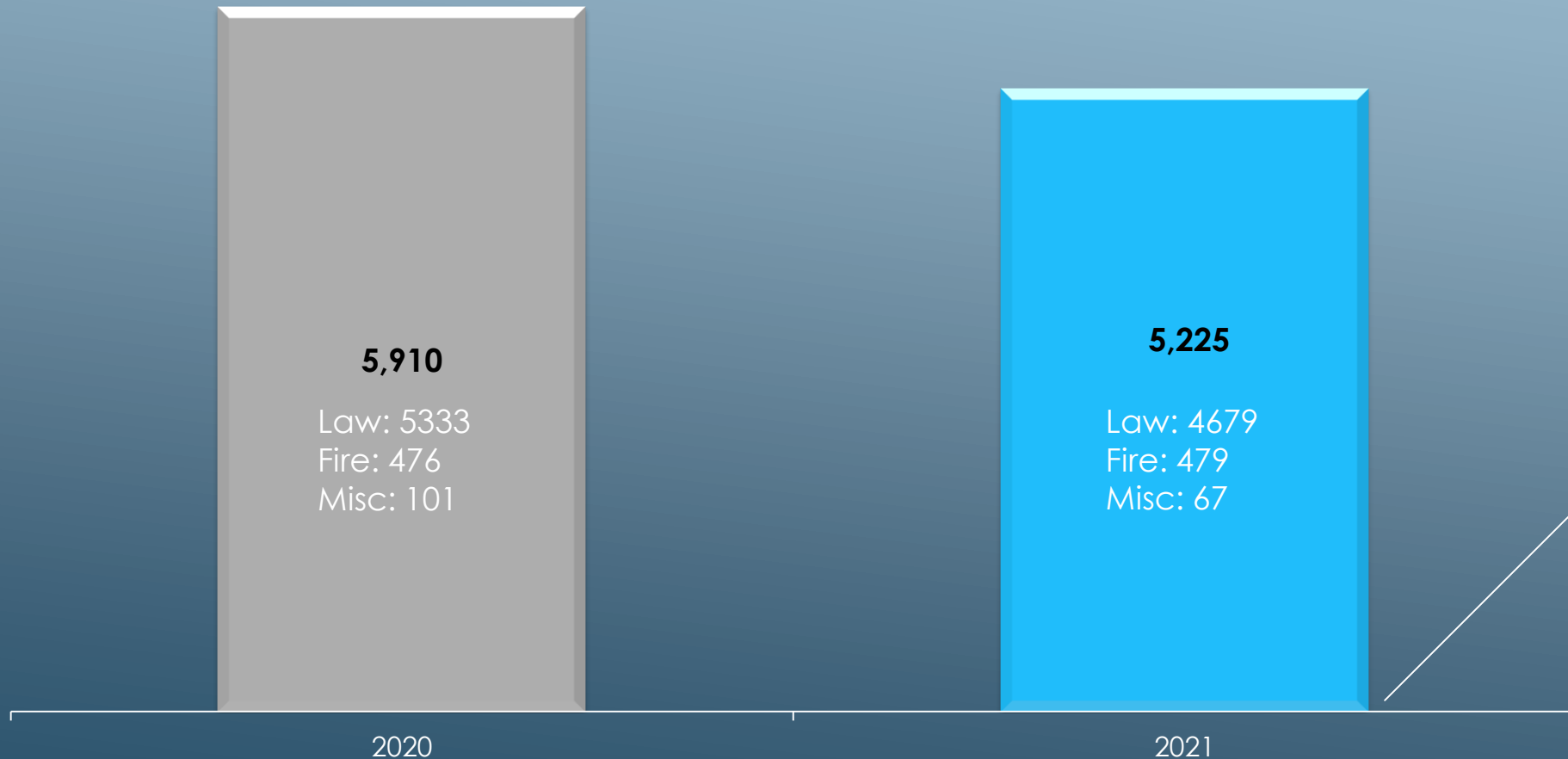

EMPLOYEES OF THE WEEK

- **Week of November 5th** – Crime Victim Advocate Irene Perez was selected for her efforts in helping crime victims receive services they may need. Irene works extensively with the District Attorney's Office and has helped neighboring agencies with their victims services programs.
- **Week of November 12th** – Officer Singleton was selected for his response to a stolen vehicle call. When responding to the call, Officer Singleton strategically monitored I69, believing the suspects would flee Rosenberg in the vehicle. Officer Singleton successfully located the stolen vehicle and was able to swiftly and safely apprehend all suspects and return the vehicle to its rightful owner.
- **Week of November 19th** – K9 Officer Manriquez was selected for this proactive performance regarding retail thefts in Brazos Town Center. Knowing a particular store was recently targeted for high volume thefts, Officer Manriquez frequently conducted property checks at the business. During one of the checks, Officer Manriquez witnessed a theft in progress and detained 4 individuals. Thousands of dollars of stolen merchandise was located in the suspects vehicle and many theft cases across several jurisdictions were solved as a result of Officer Manriquez's investigation.
