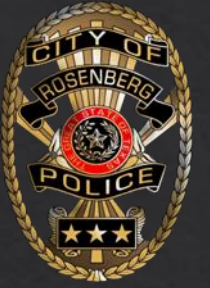

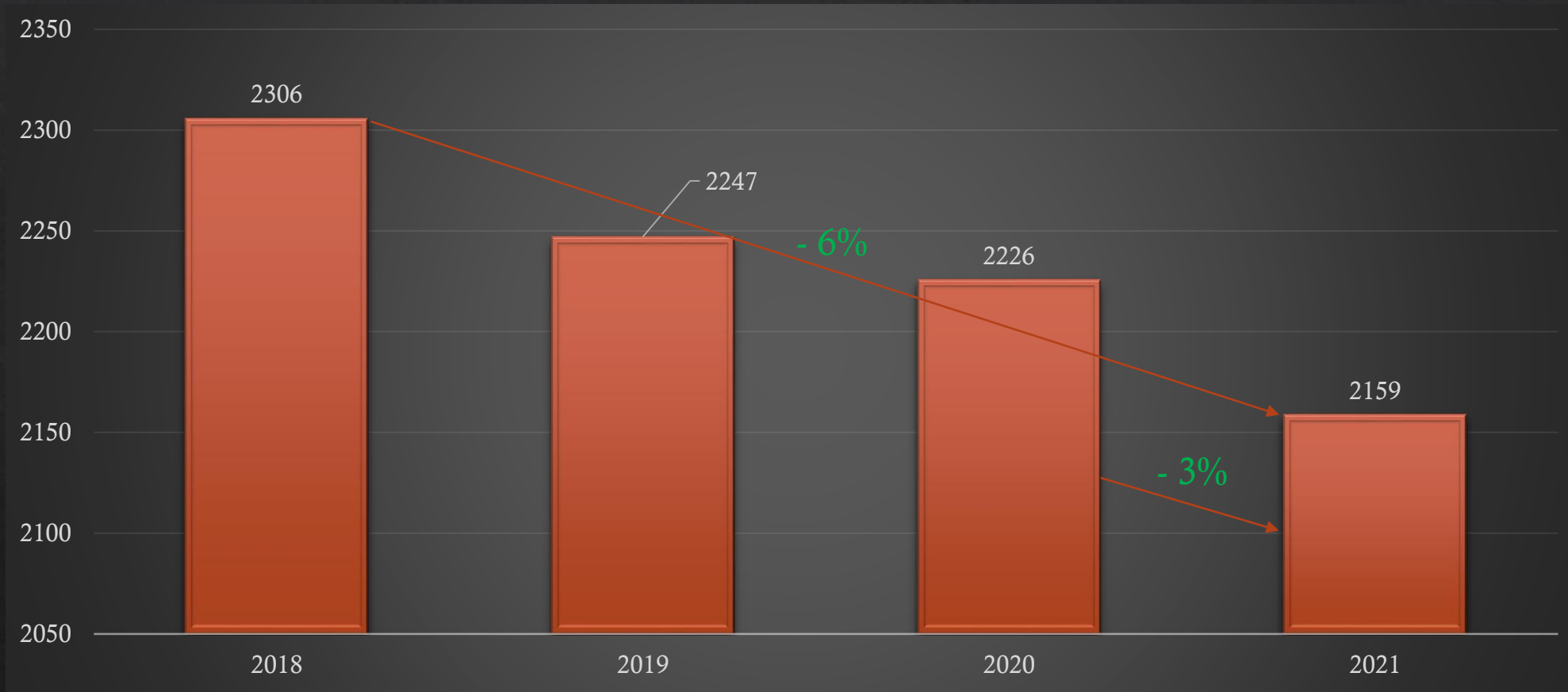

# Crime Statistics

- ◇ “Since crime is a sociological phenomenon influenced by a variety of factors, the FBI discourages ranking locations or making comparisons as a way of measuring law enforcement effectiveness. Some of this data may not be comparable to previous years because of differing levels of participation over time.”

- ◇ The data provided is for informational use only and may differ from official Rosenberg Police crime data. The police department’s crime database is continuously updated, therefore, reports run at different times may produce different results.
- ◇ The Rosenberg Police Department submits data via the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS). Currently, 63% of law enforcement agencies in the U.S. submit data to NIBRS. NIBRS collects data under 24 offense codes consisting of 52 Group A crimes and 10 Group B crimes.

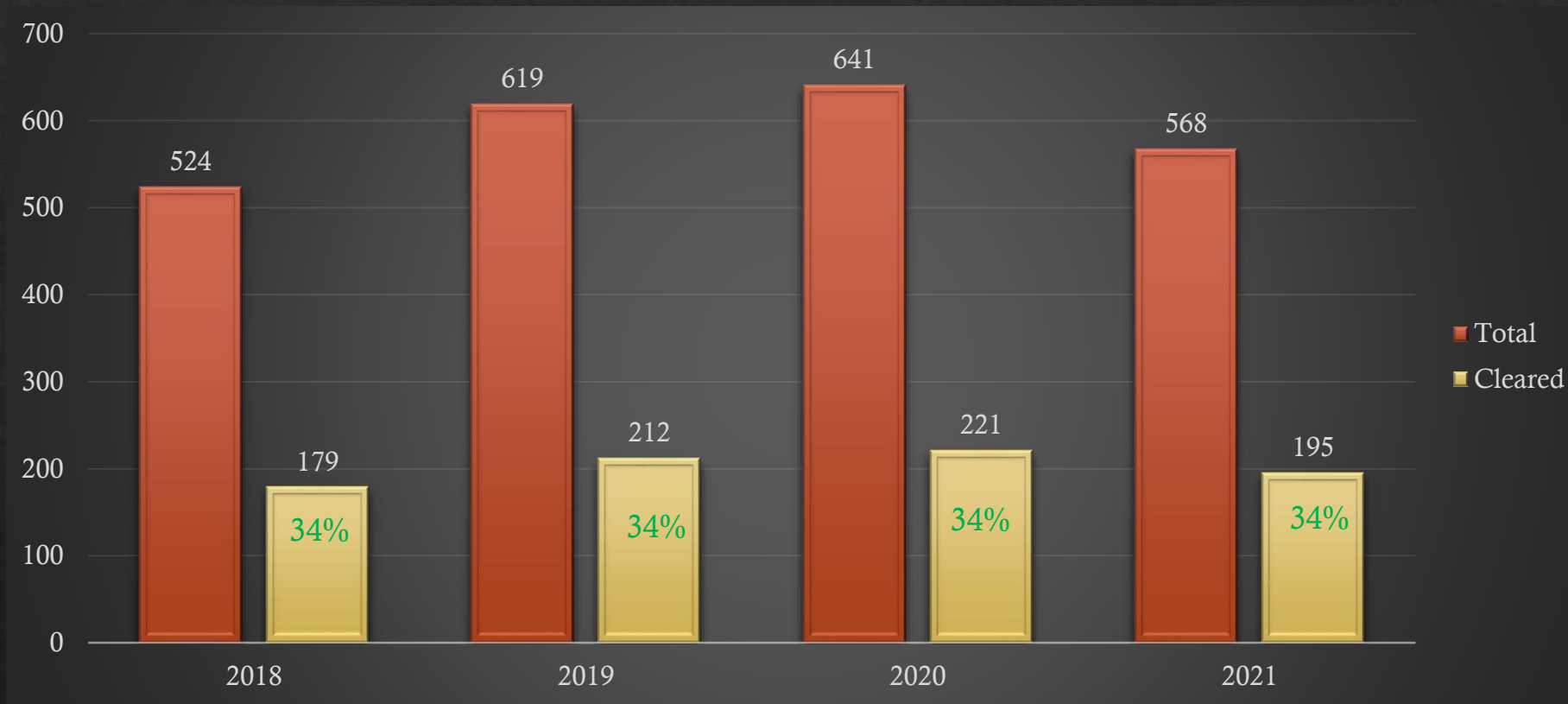
# Nibrs Group A Crimes – 4 year comparison

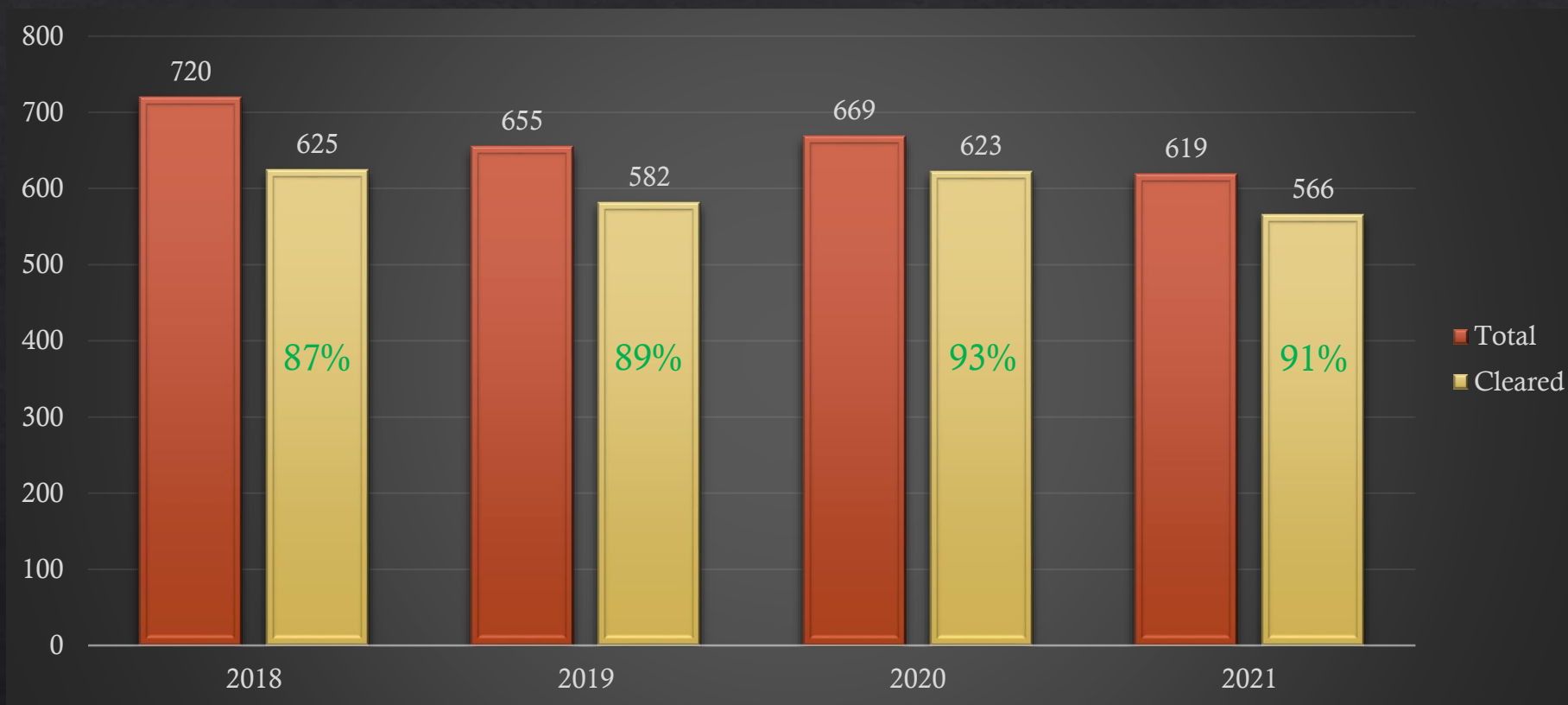

# Person crimes – 4 year comparison

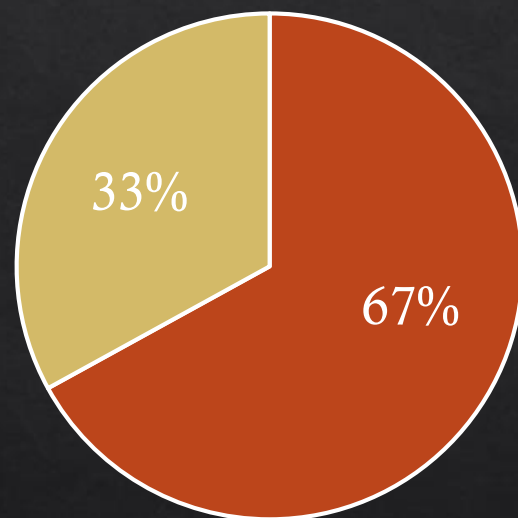
*Simple Assault, Intimidation*

Relationship between Suspect and Victim

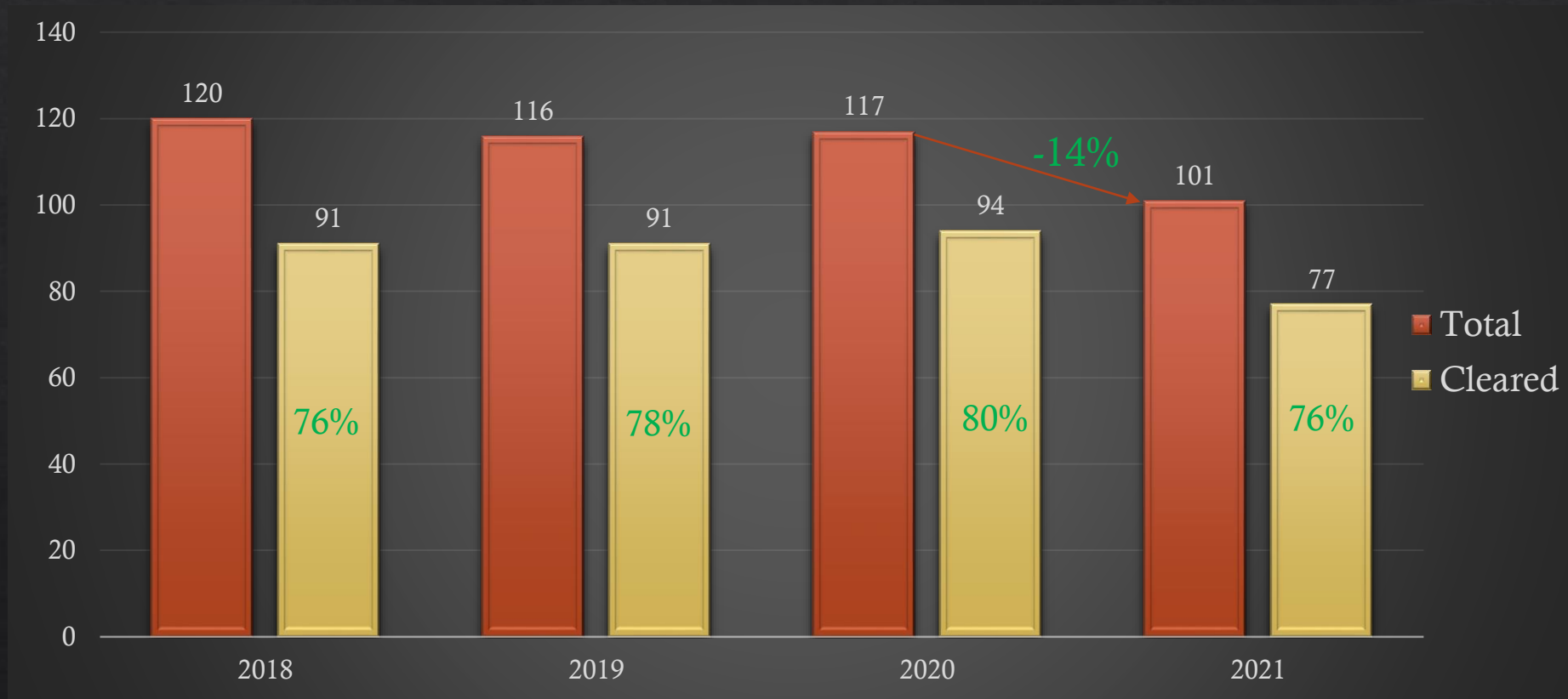

*Homicide, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Sexual Assault (Rape)*

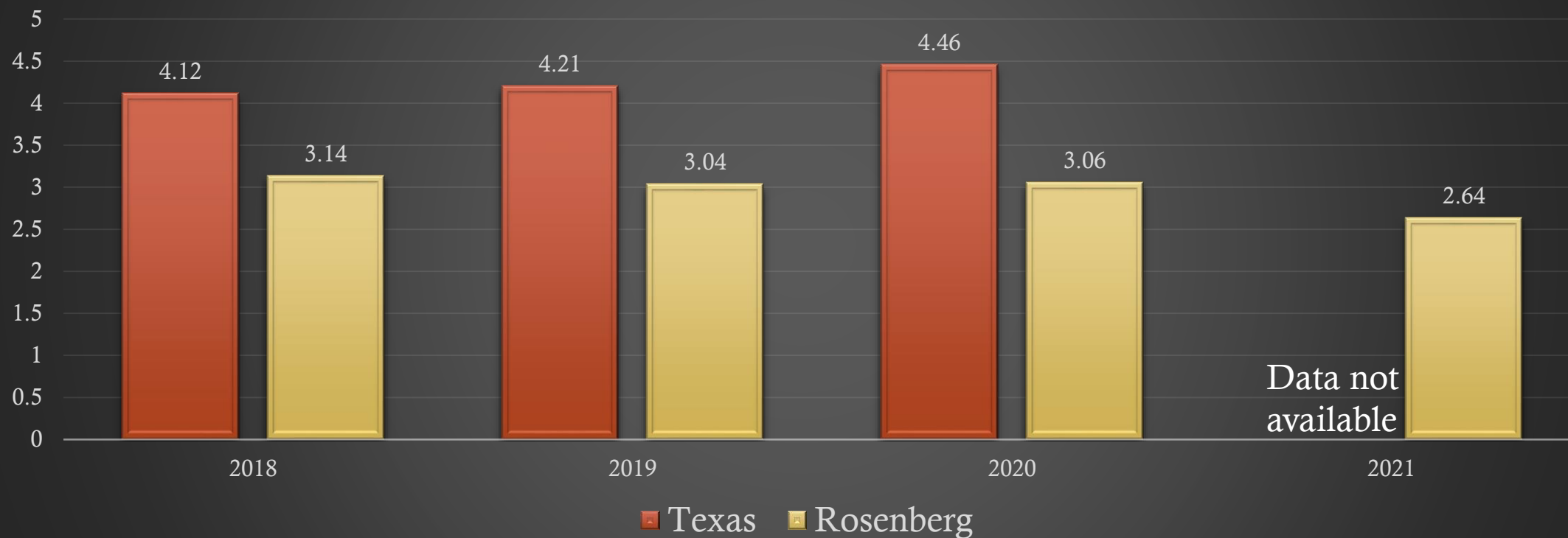




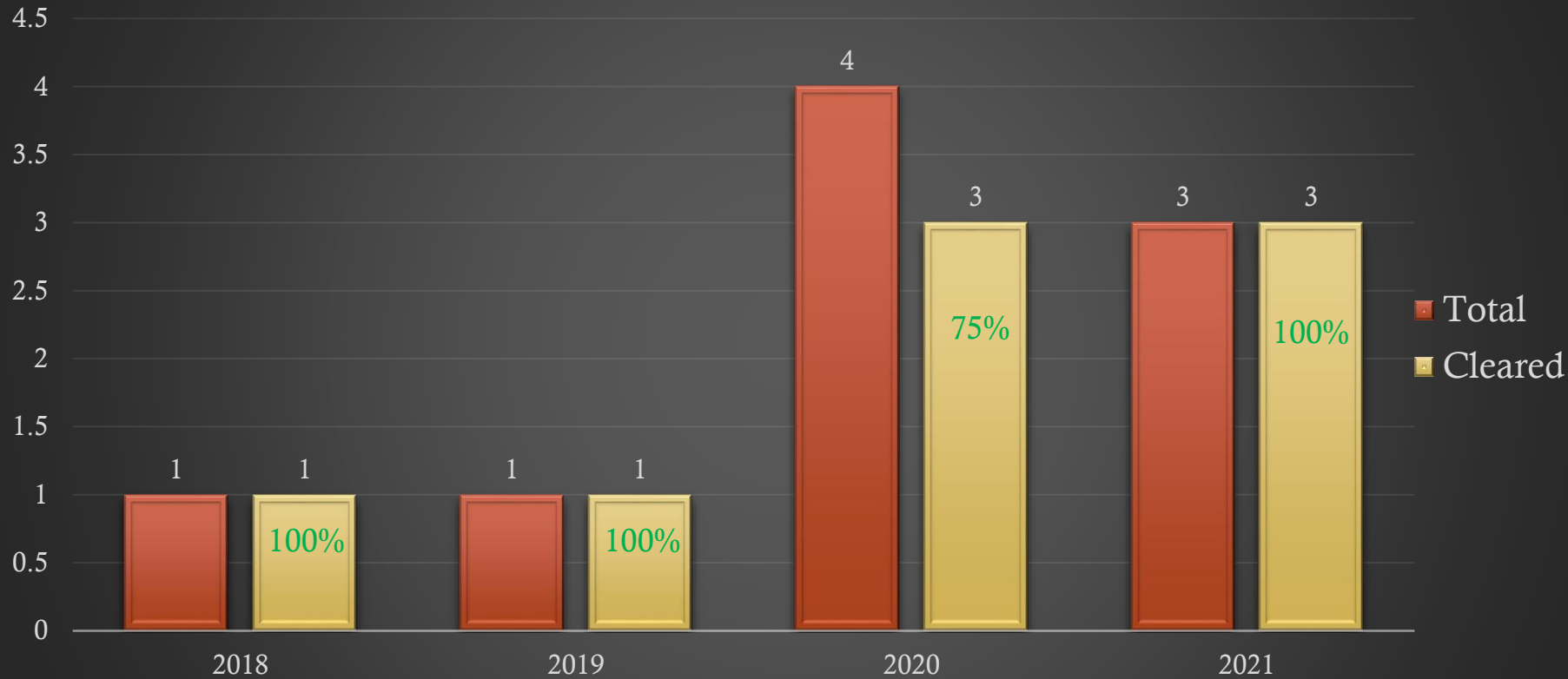
# Violent Crime

# Homicide/Manslaughter – 4 year comparison

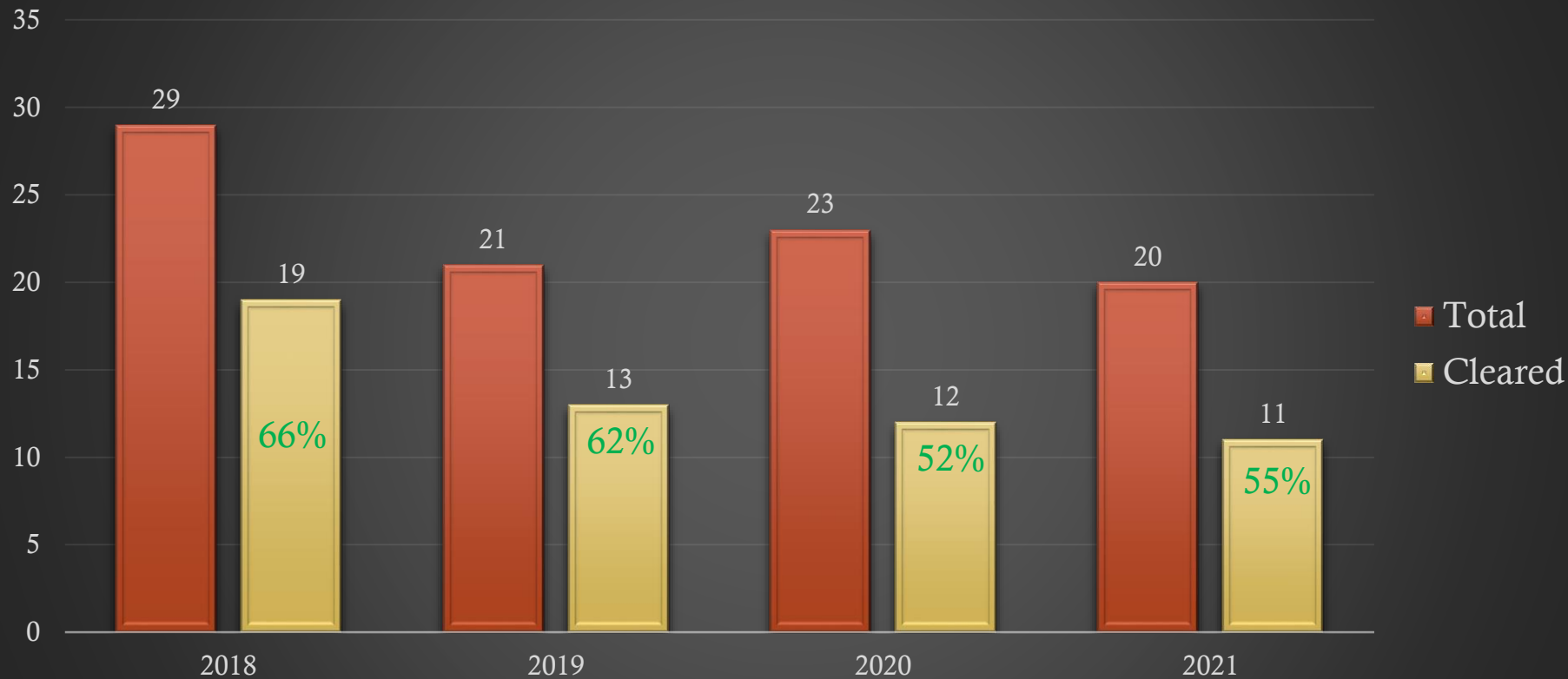

In Texas, the clearance rate for Homicide/Manslaughter in 2020 was 53%.



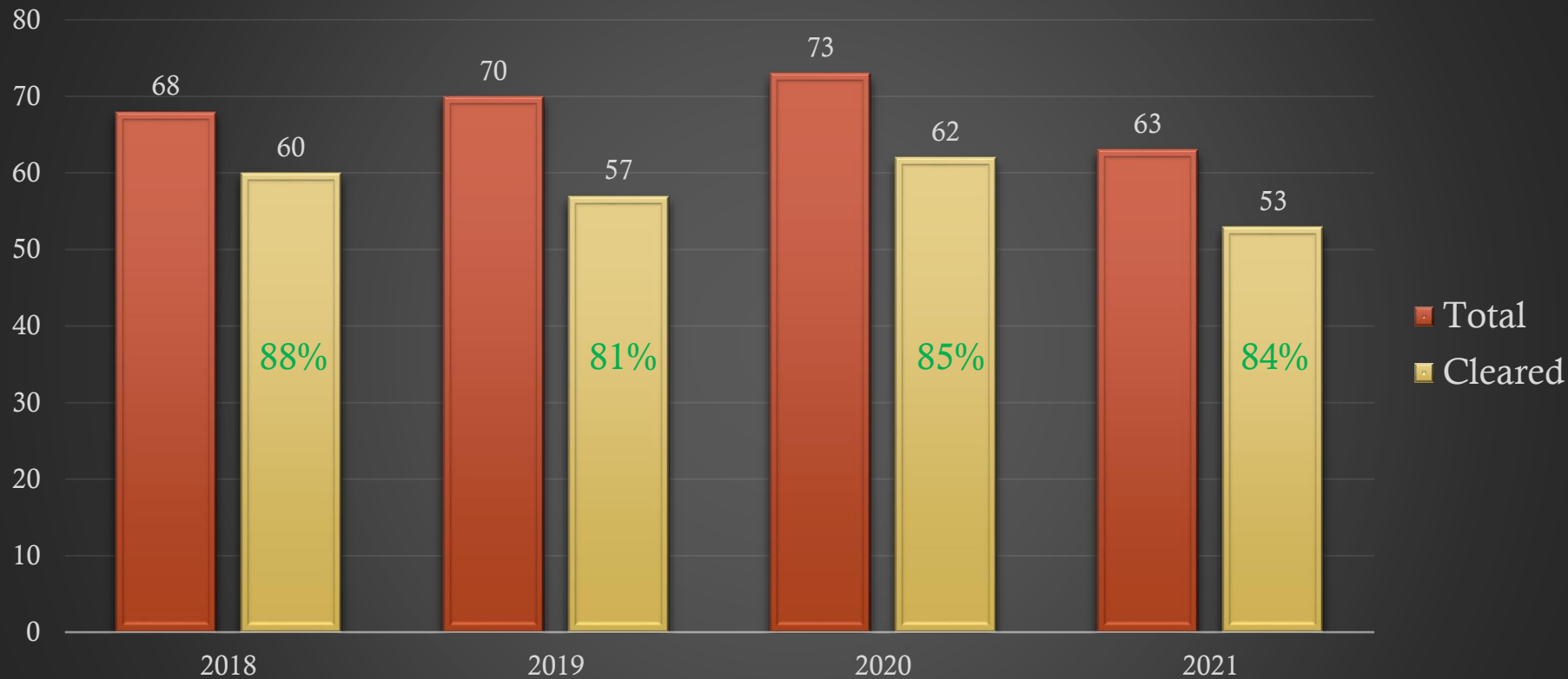
# Robbery – 4 year comparison

# Aggravated Assault – 4 year comparison

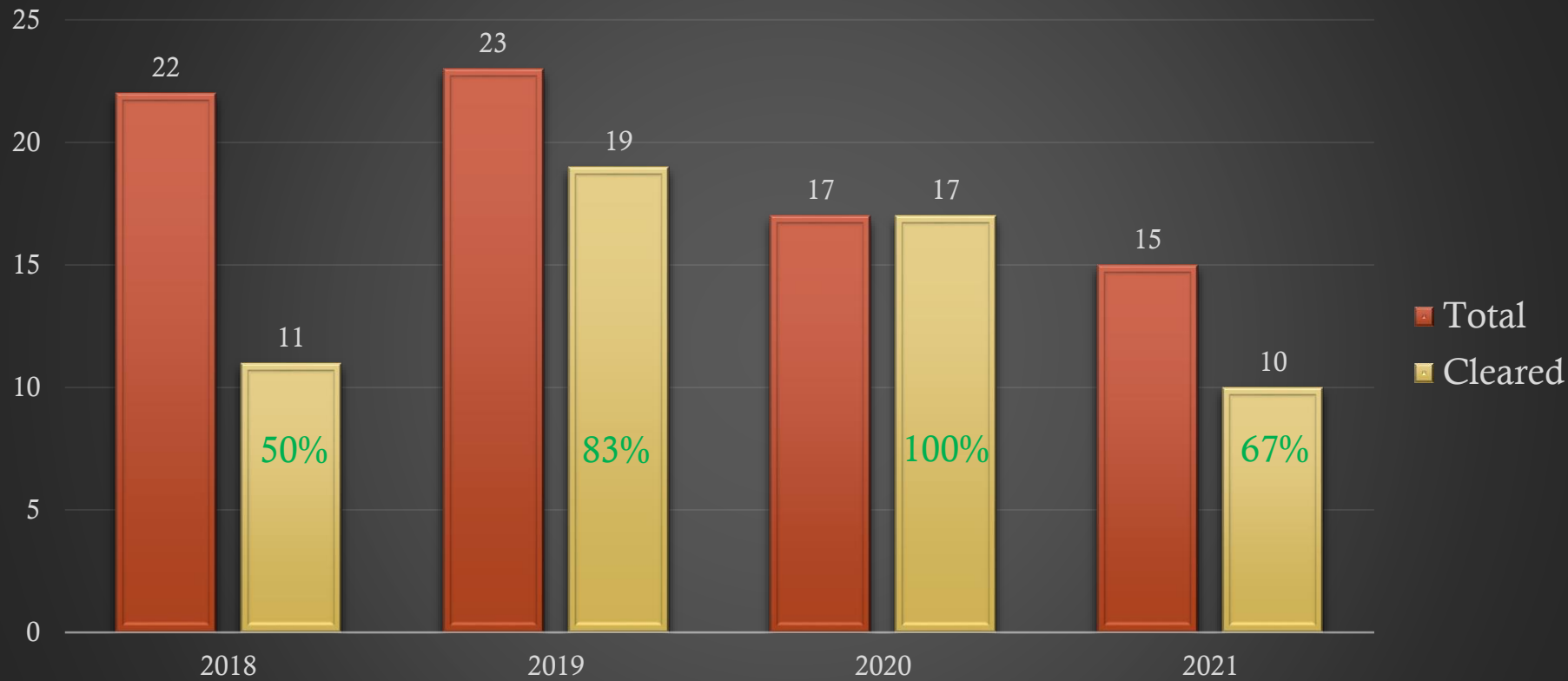

# Sexual Assault (rape) – 4 year comparison



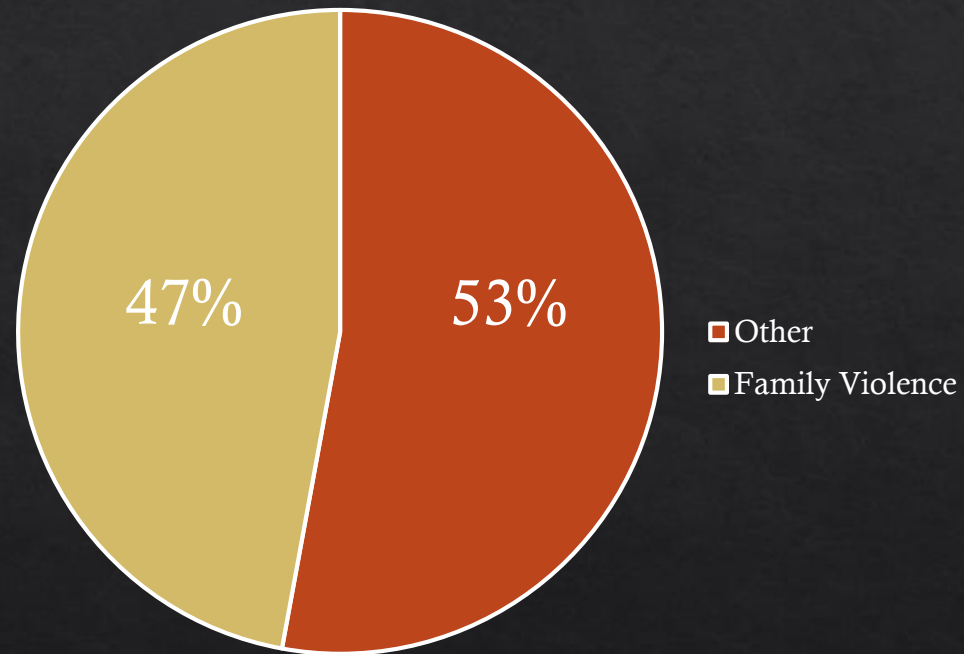

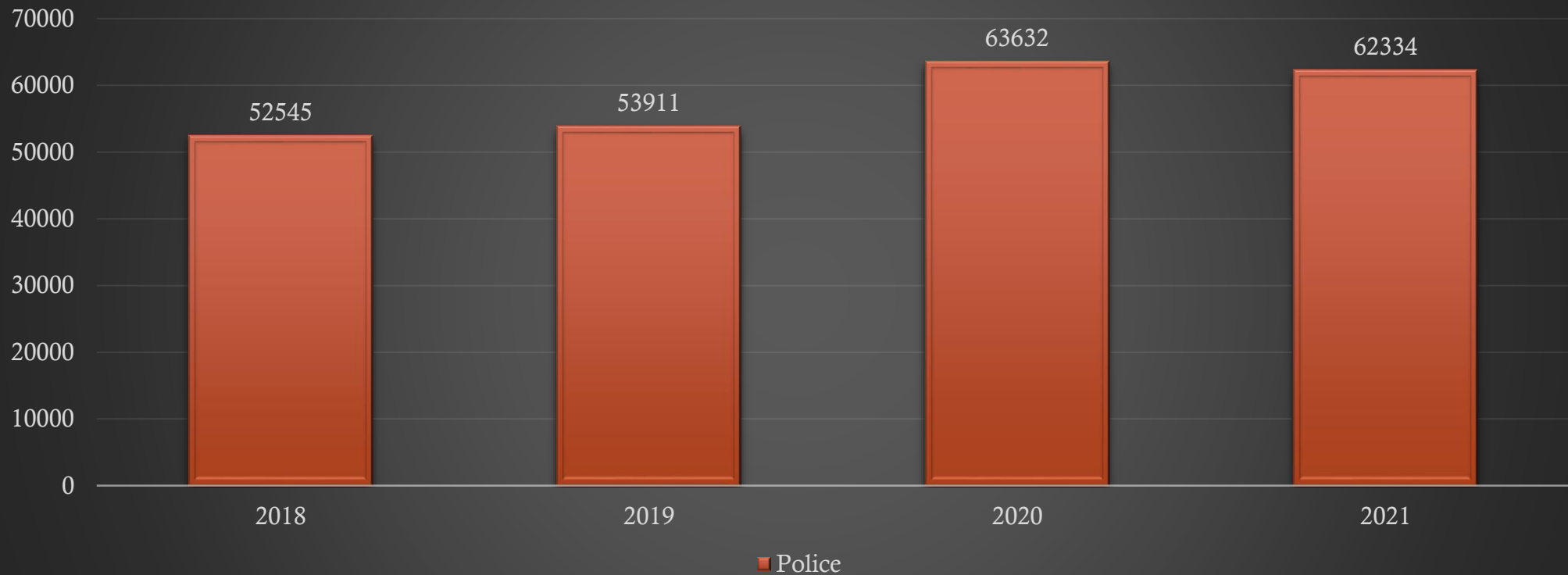

Suspect / Victim Relationship



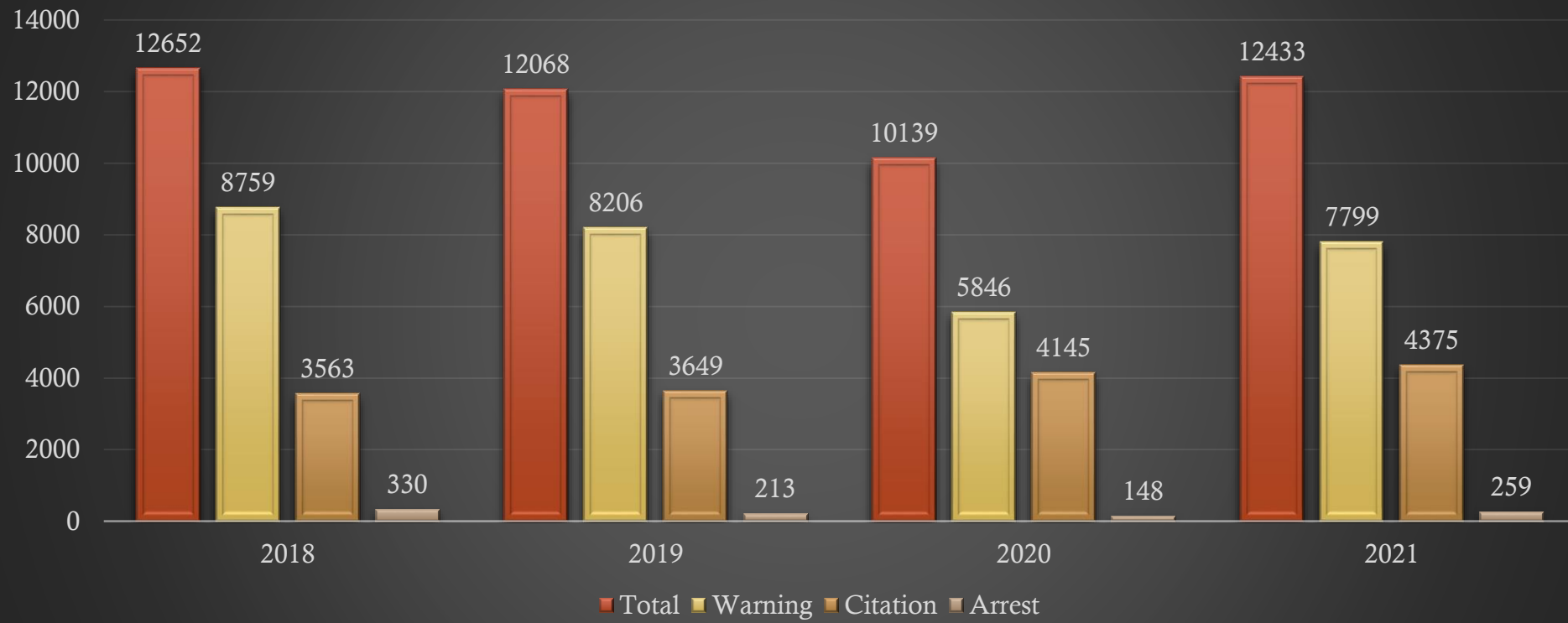


# Total Calls requiring a police response – 4 year comparison



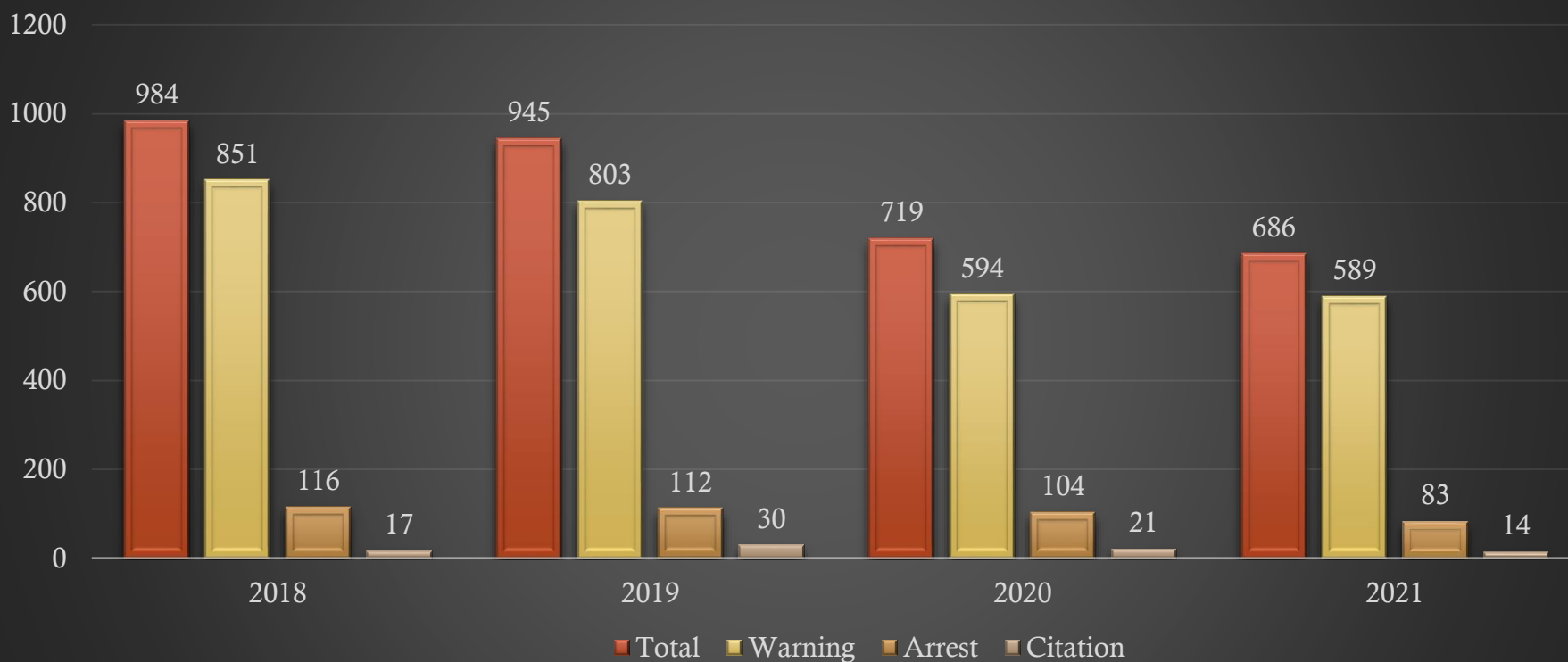


# Traffic Stops – 4 year comparison



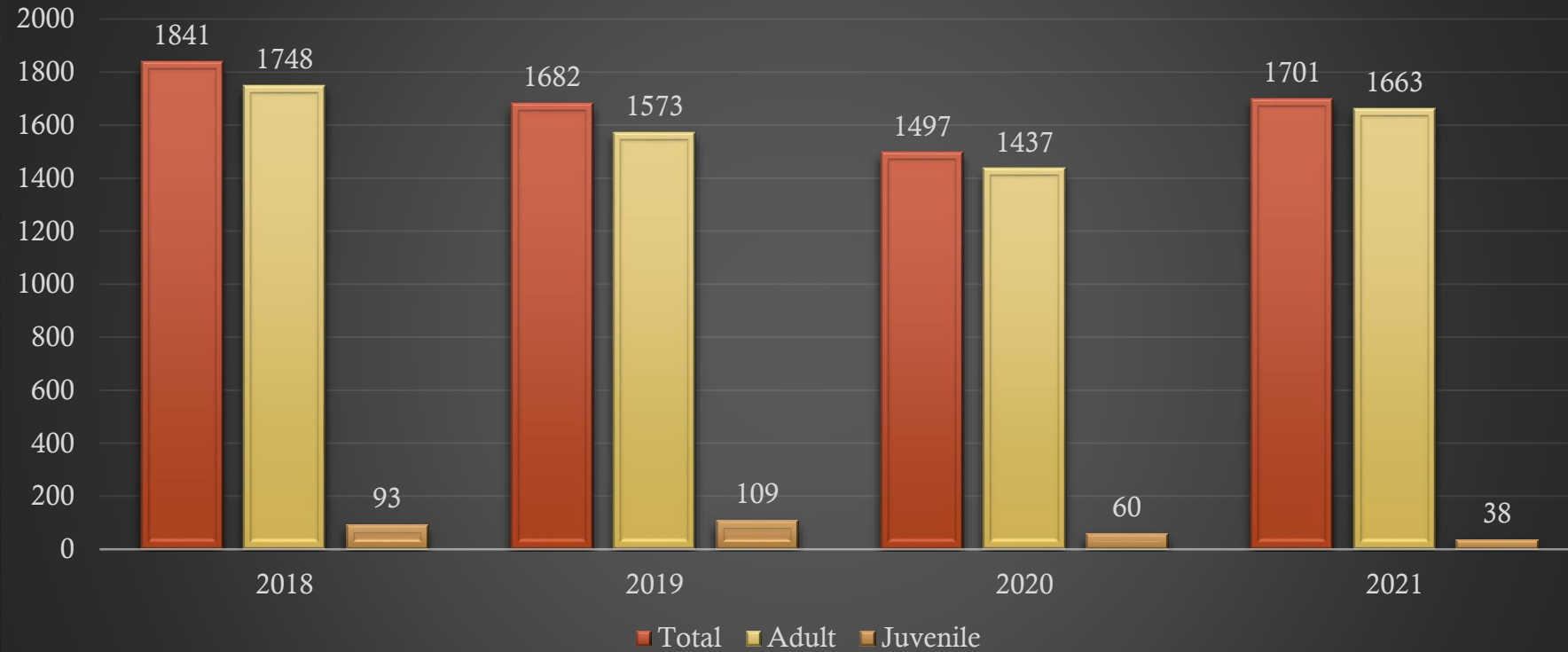


# Pedestrian Stops – 4 year comparison



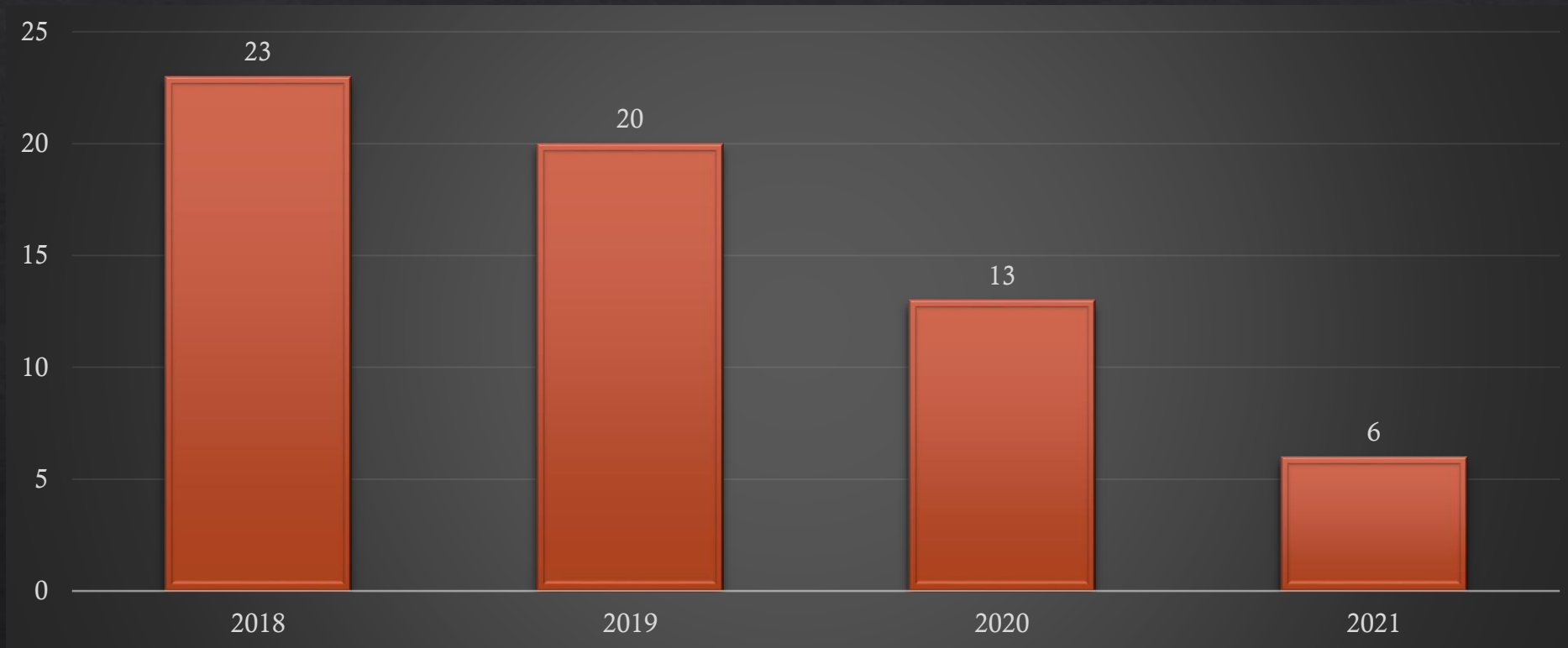


# Arrests – 4 year comparison

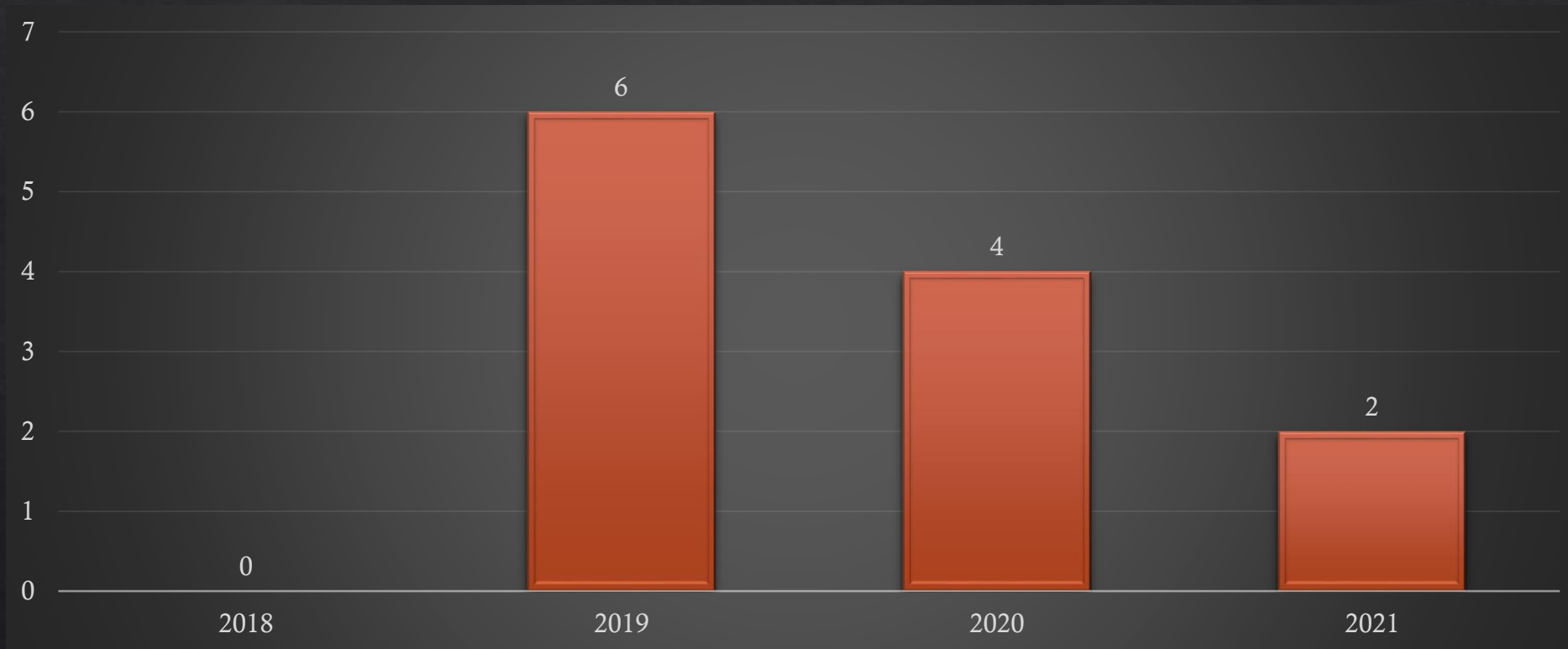




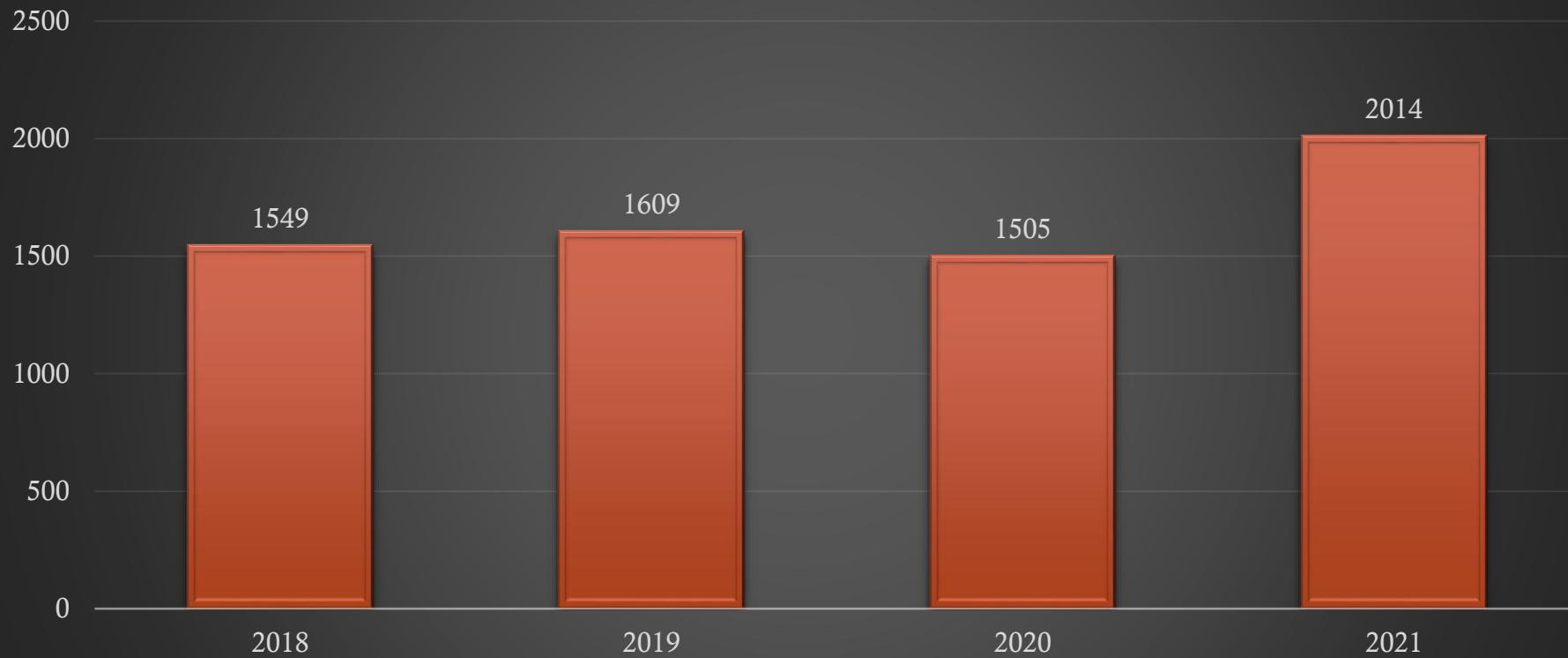
# Auto vs. pedestrian accidents – 4 year comparison

# Traffic complaints received – 4 year comparison



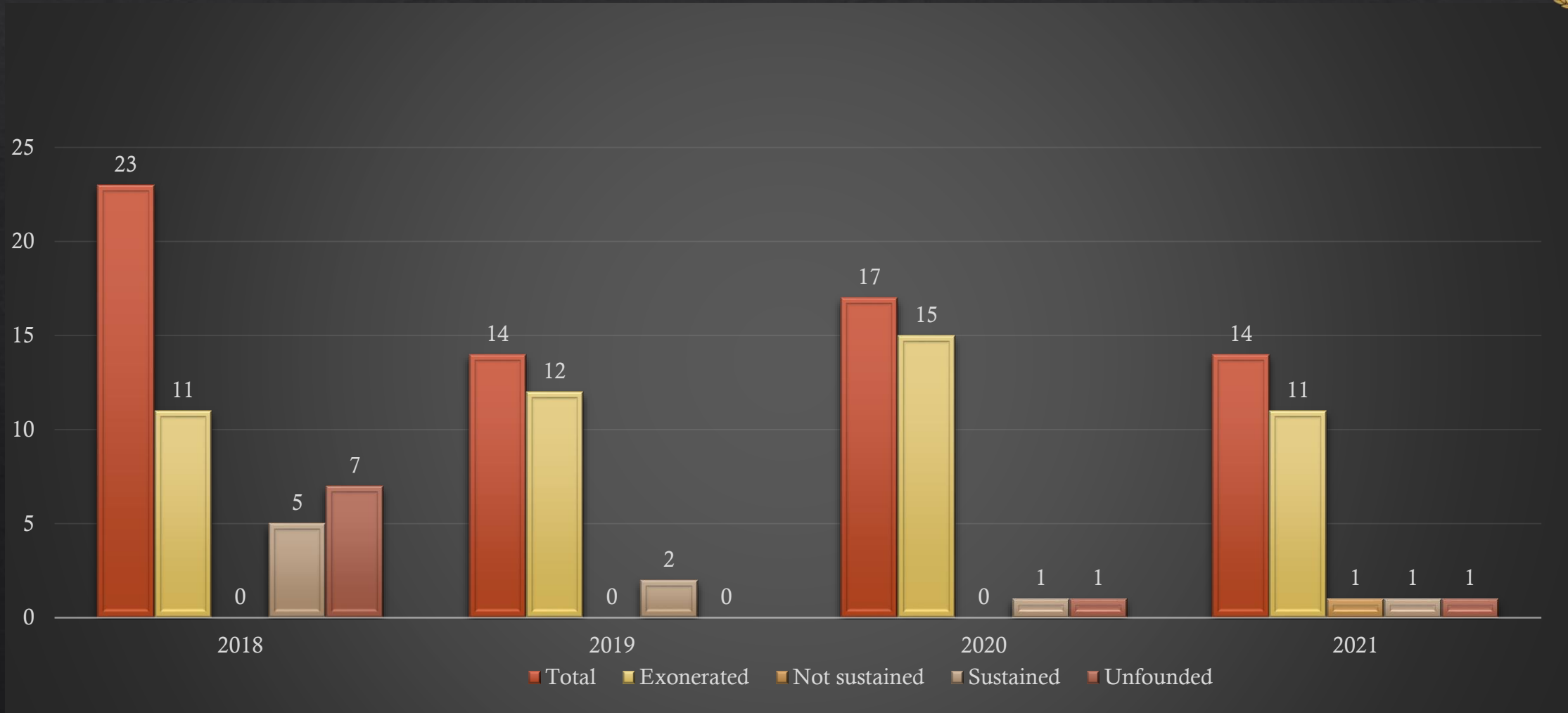
# Citizen Complaints 2021



- ◆ Individuals can file complaints with the police department via the city website or by filling out a complaint form in the police department lobby.
- ◆ All complaints are thoroughly investigated. Upon completion, a complaint is adjudicated as one of the following categories:
  1. Unfounded - No truth to the allegation
  2. Exonerated- The incident occurred but the actions were lawful and proper or were justified under existing conditions.
  3. Not sustained - Insufficient evidence to prove the allegations.
  4. Sustained - Allegations are true in relation to the preponderance of evidence of the investigation.

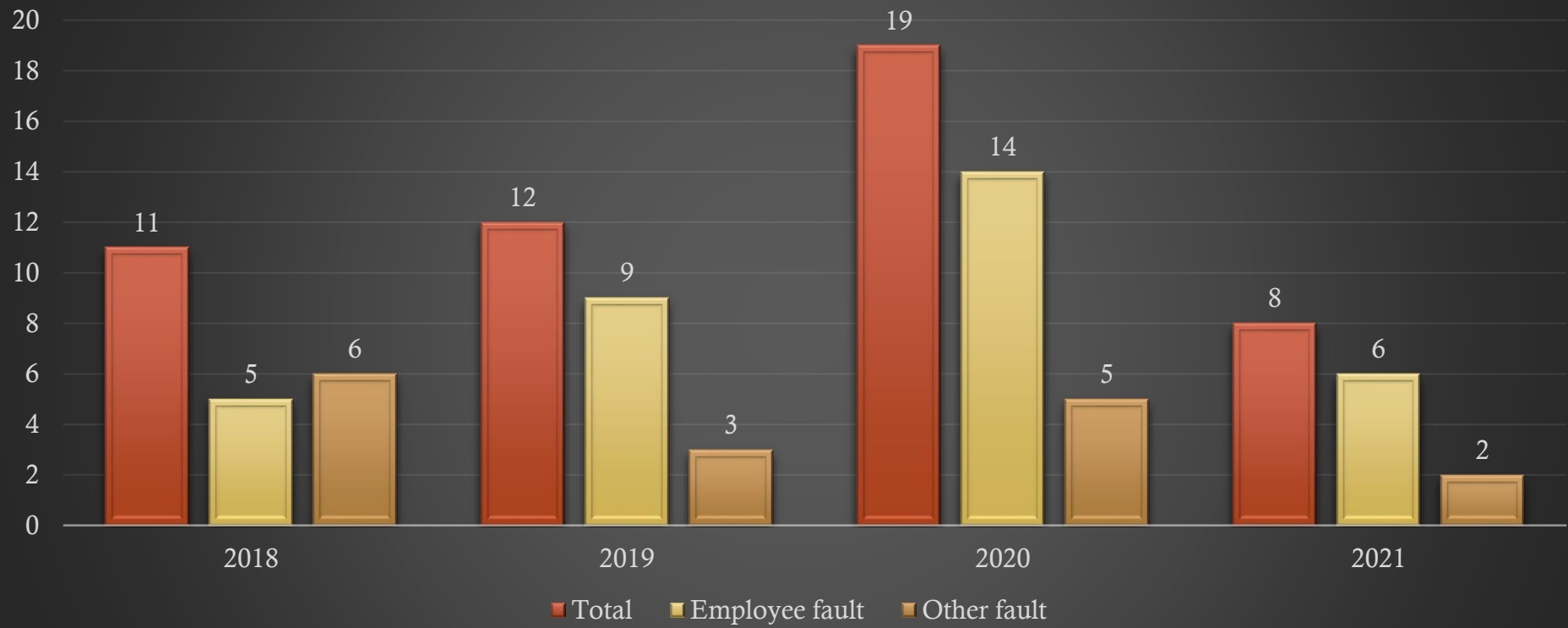

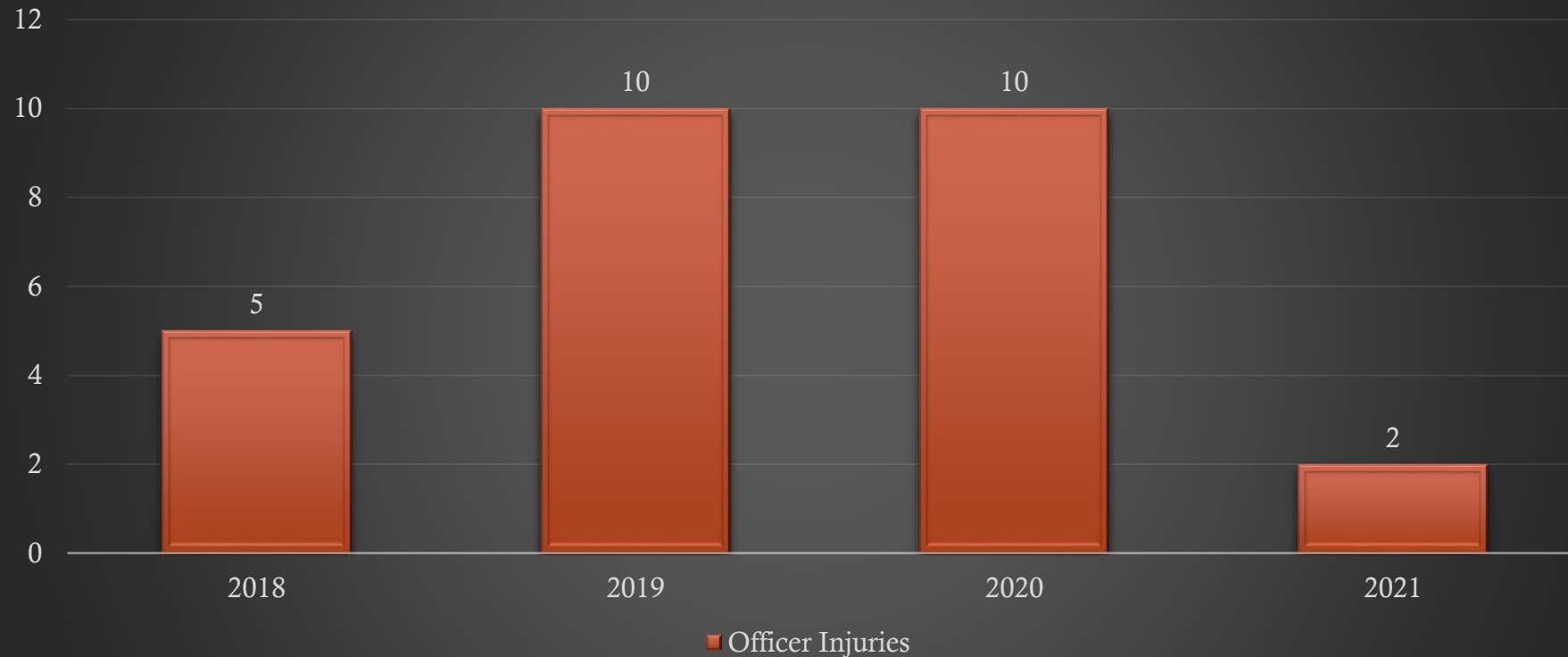




# Fleet accidents – 4 year comparison

# 2021 Accomplishments



- Re-organization of the Police Department, leading to the formation of the Operations Division, to consist of the Strategic Enforcement Team, Community Resource Officers, Task Force Officers, Crime Analyst, SWAT Team, and the RPD Firearms Range/RPD Firearms Instructors.
- Texas Law Enforcement Best Practices recognition.
- Creation of the Strategic Enforcement Team, to include four Officers.
- Selection of four Officers to be assigned to the Strategic Enforcement Team.
- Revamping of RPD Firearms range agreement.
- 4 year case closure audit and update.
- SWAT Team uniform transition to “multicam”.
- Finalized purchase of new handguns equipped with red dot sights to be utilized by the SWAT Team.

# 2022 Priorities



- Complete SET Officer transition from Patrol Division to the Operations Division.
- Develop extensive group and individual stat tracking for the Strategic Enforcement Team.
- Mentorship of SET Officers, while promoting a proactive and professional unit.
- Violent crime suppression.
- Complete Community Resource Officer and Sergeant transition to the Operations Division.
- Establish working network of similar outside Teams/Divisions in the region to assist SET with intelligence gathering, operations, and training.
- Establish additional working space and resources to be utilized by SET Officers, Community Resource Officers, and Task Force Officers.
- Incorporate and utilize Community Resource Officers and Task Force Officers for support within the City of Rosenberg, specifically within the Strategic Enforcement Team.
- Promote further communication and proactive responses by the Crime Analyst to both SET and CID.

# 2022 Priorities



- Monthly Task Force Officer meetings.
- Bi-weekly RPD range inspections.
- Purchase new conex storage unit for use at the RPD range.
- Increased investigative activity by TFO assigned to the Fort Bend County Narcotics Task Force, specifically within the City of Rosenberg.
- Certify additional Firearms Instructors for Patrol Rifle and Pistol Red Dot.
- Certify additional firearms armorers.
- Research methods and equipment (audio/video) to be utilized for proactive sting type operations, facilitating thorough documentation of in-progress crimes.
- Community Resource Officers meeting with HOA's within the City of Rosenberg, promoting the installation of Flock camera systems.
