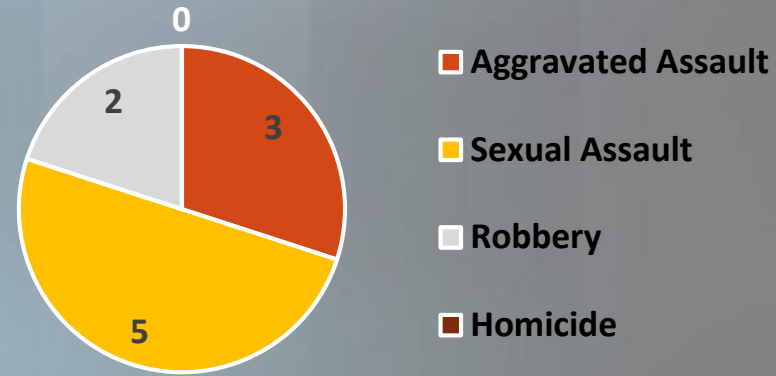
# Communications Division

  - 1,049 Other incidents (water, off-duty animal control, etc)

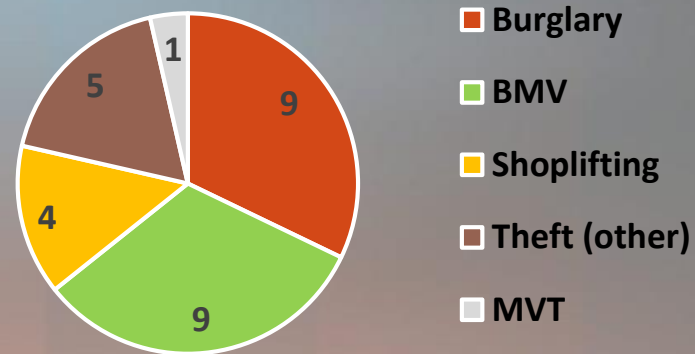
# Patrol Division

### January 2018 Part 1: Person Crimes

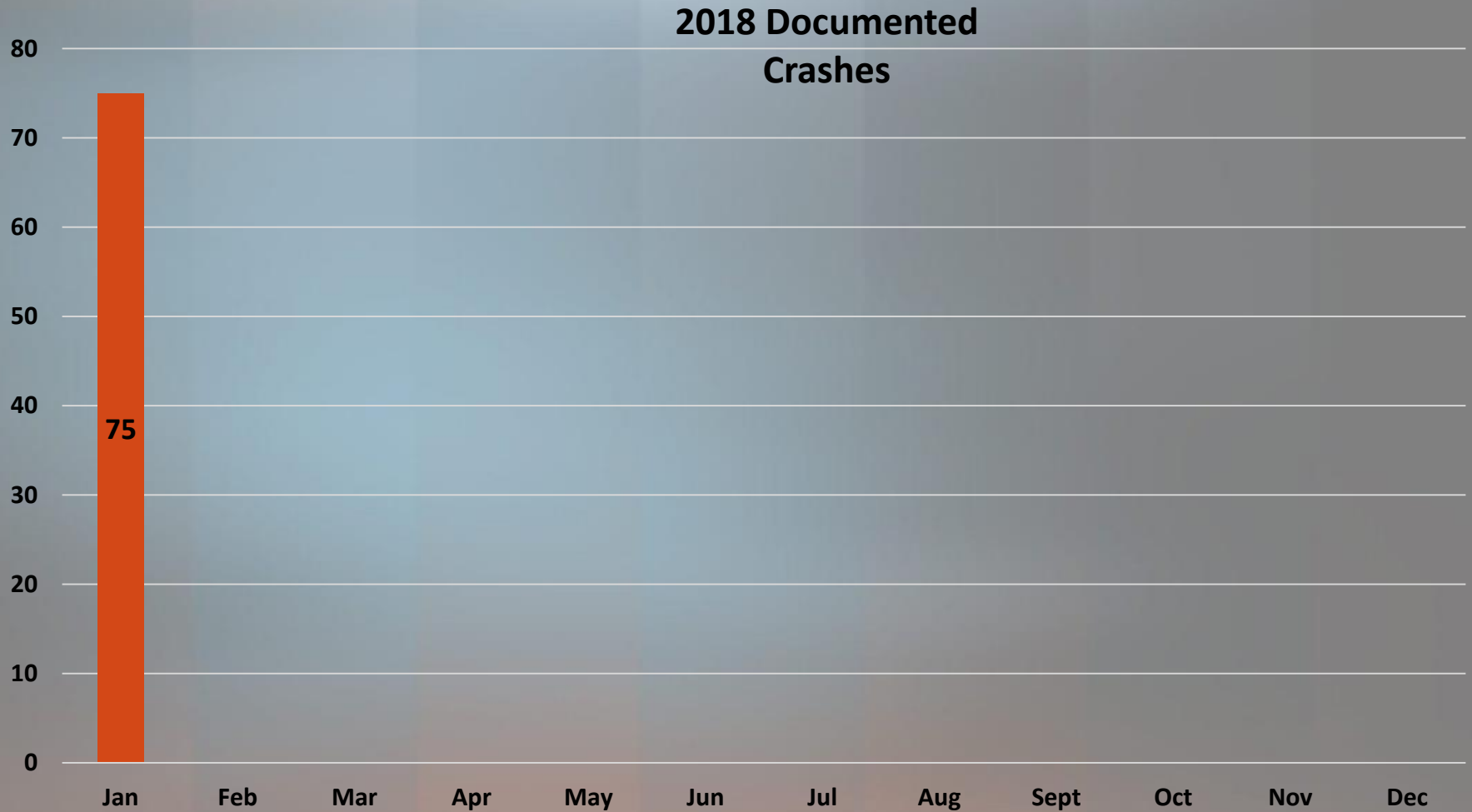


### January 2018 Part 1: Property Crimes

# Criminal Investigations Division

- **Notable Investigations (Slide 1 of 2)**

- 18-01422: 2529 Ave H, Sky Auto Sales, 01/09, 21:00 – 01/10, 07:30. Suspect caught on video: Suspect (B/M, thin build, average height) ransacked all office areas, taking files containing spare car keys. Suspect then used the stolen keys to steal a vehicle from a customer's residence (UUMV 18-01419), which was later recovered in Wharton.
- 18-01601: Bank Jugging at Wells Fargo, 6511 Reading Rd, 1/11, 15:50 hrs. Suspects were already on scene “hunting” for a potential victim, when they saw the victim place his cash deposit inside his vehicle while he tended to business phone calls.
- 18-3502: Bank Jugging at Valero, 26111 SW Fwy, 1/24, 16:50 hrs. Victim followed from Wells Fargo, 6511 Reading Rd. Suspects: 3 B/M, black newer model Buick Lacrosse, paper plates.

# Criminal Investigations Division

- **Notable Investigations (Slide 2 of 2)**

- 18-3678, Aggravated Robbery - 01/25/2018, 18:41 hrs, 2516 Ave H/99¢ Only. Suspect posed as a solicitor asking for money. When the victim retrieved his wallet, the suspect displayed a kitchen knife and took the wallet. The suspect fled to a waiting white 2D passenger car. As of 02/07/18, the victim has declined prosecution.
- 18-02667, Aggravated Robbery - 01/18/2018 at approximately 18:00 hrs, the W/M subject pictured below along with an unidentified older H/M kidnapped the victim at knife point from Wells Fargo, 2910 Ave H. The suspect vehicle is described as an older model heavy duty two toned black over gold truck with a gooseneck tailgate, light bar on the roof.
