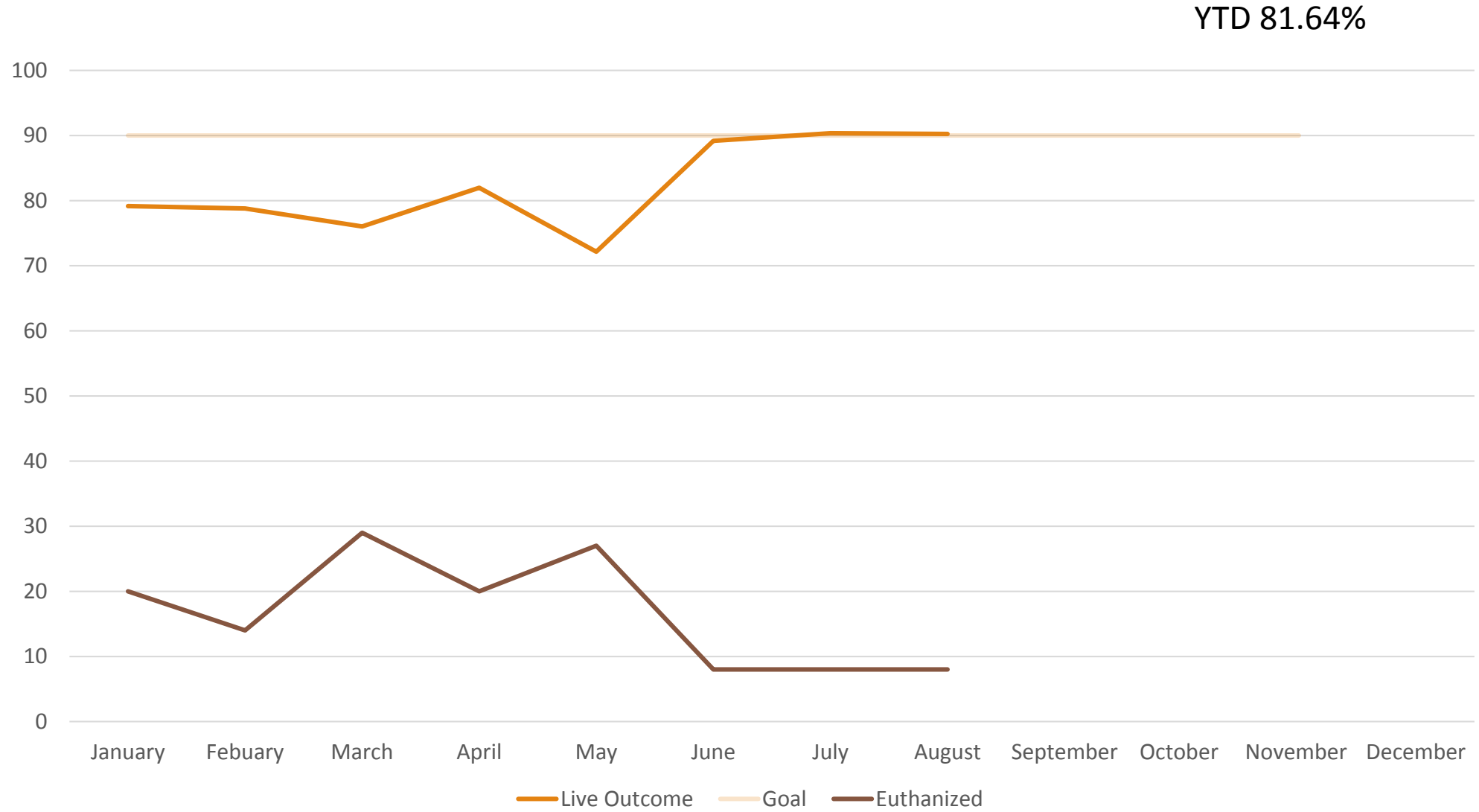

# Animal Control Shelter Advisory Board

## Update

- The Board met on September 5th.
- The City's "No Kill Shelter" Resolution was reviewed and revisions were requested.
- The Board approved amendments to draft Bylaws and recommended approval of the Bylaws to City Council.
- The Board voted to move forward on implementation of the suggestion box at the Shelter.
- The Board discussed guidelines for recruiting volunteer assistance.
- The Board discussed tracking and reporting of donations for the Shelter with suggestions made by members
- The Board reviewed the City's Code as it relates to community cats running at large and a trap, neuter, and release (TNR) program.
- The Board discussed the approved FY2019 Shelter budget.
- Staff is working with the Board to establish a better volunteer system using online tracking.
- Staff is working to establish a dedicated email that will address Shelter activities, questions, and concerns

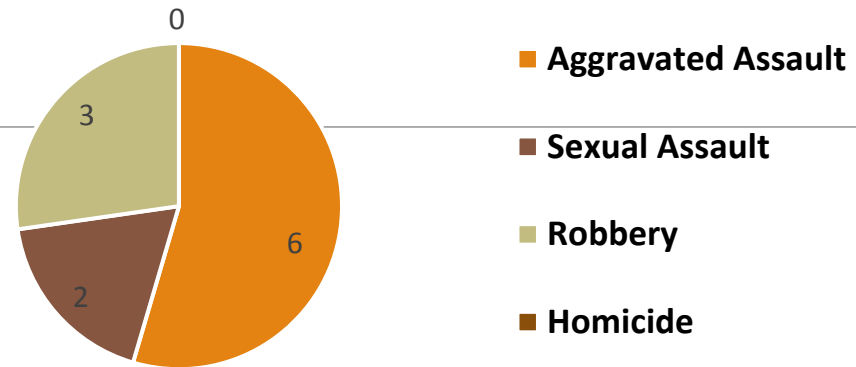

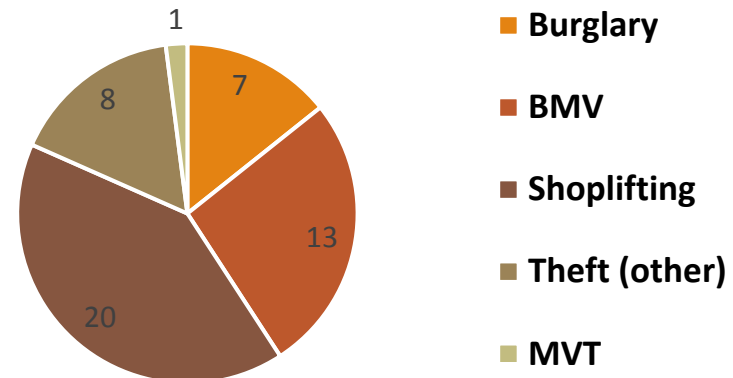

## August 2018 Part 1: Person Crimes



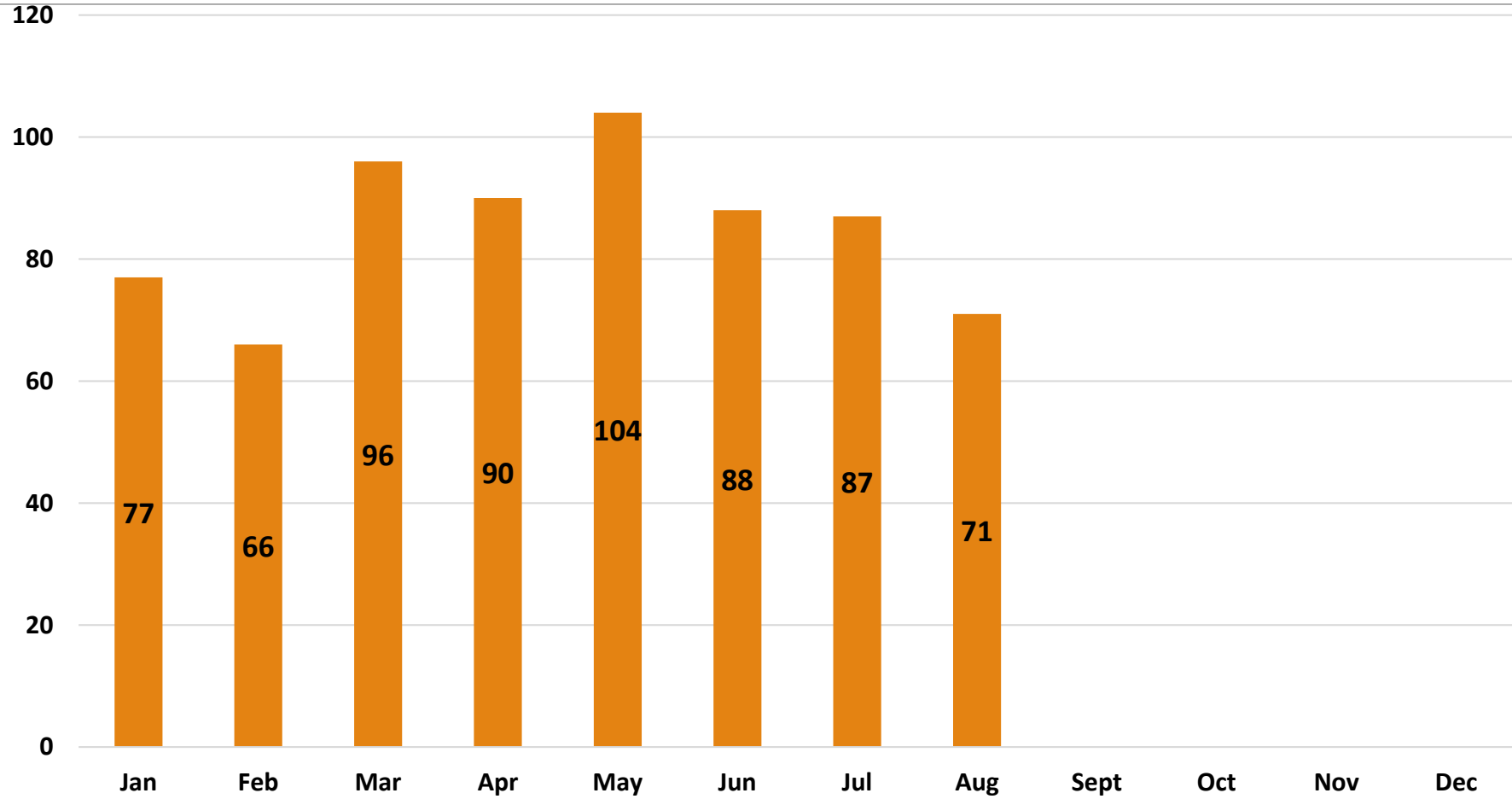
## August 2018 Part 1: Property Crimes

# Patrol and Communication Division

## Recruitment and Hiring

---

### Patrol

- Three (3) new officers actively on the Field Training Program
- Currently the department has nine (9) openings: four (4) from SRO division; four (5) from Patrol division
- Hiring process for police officers closed with thirty (30) applications received; sixteen (16) turned in personal history statements per requirements
- As of 9/13/18:
  - (12) applicants took PT; (2) failed
  - (8) oral boards conducted; (4) passed interview
  - (2) applicants scheduled for oral boards

### Communication

- Full time positions were opened and advertised
- Communications Supervisor: (2) openings
  - Hiring process for Communications Supervisor closed on 9/2/18
- Communications Specialist: (2) openings
  - Nineteen (19) applications approved
  - As of 9/4/18, eight (8) applicants tested
  - Three (3) applicants scheduled for interviews

# Communications Division

## Calls received

- 7,558 10-digit non-emergency calls received
- 1,691 9-1-1 calls received
- Average 841 calls per Telecommunications Officer (TCO)

## 5,967 Dispatched calls for service

- 4,448 Law incidents
- 478 Fire incidents
- 1,041 Other incidents (water, off-duty animal control, etc)

# School Resource Division

---

- School began August 27, 2018, with Carter Elementary opening its doors this year. (Located at 8500 A. Meyer Rd.)
- SRO division consists of 11 officers, 2 Sergeants, and 1 Lieutenant
- LCISD Board of Trustees approved the addition of 6 more SROs due to the rapid growth of the District
- 10 new patrol vehicles were also approved by the Board of Trustees for the new officers and to begin replacing the aging fleet of the SRO Division
- School enrollment will start at approximately 33,267 students
