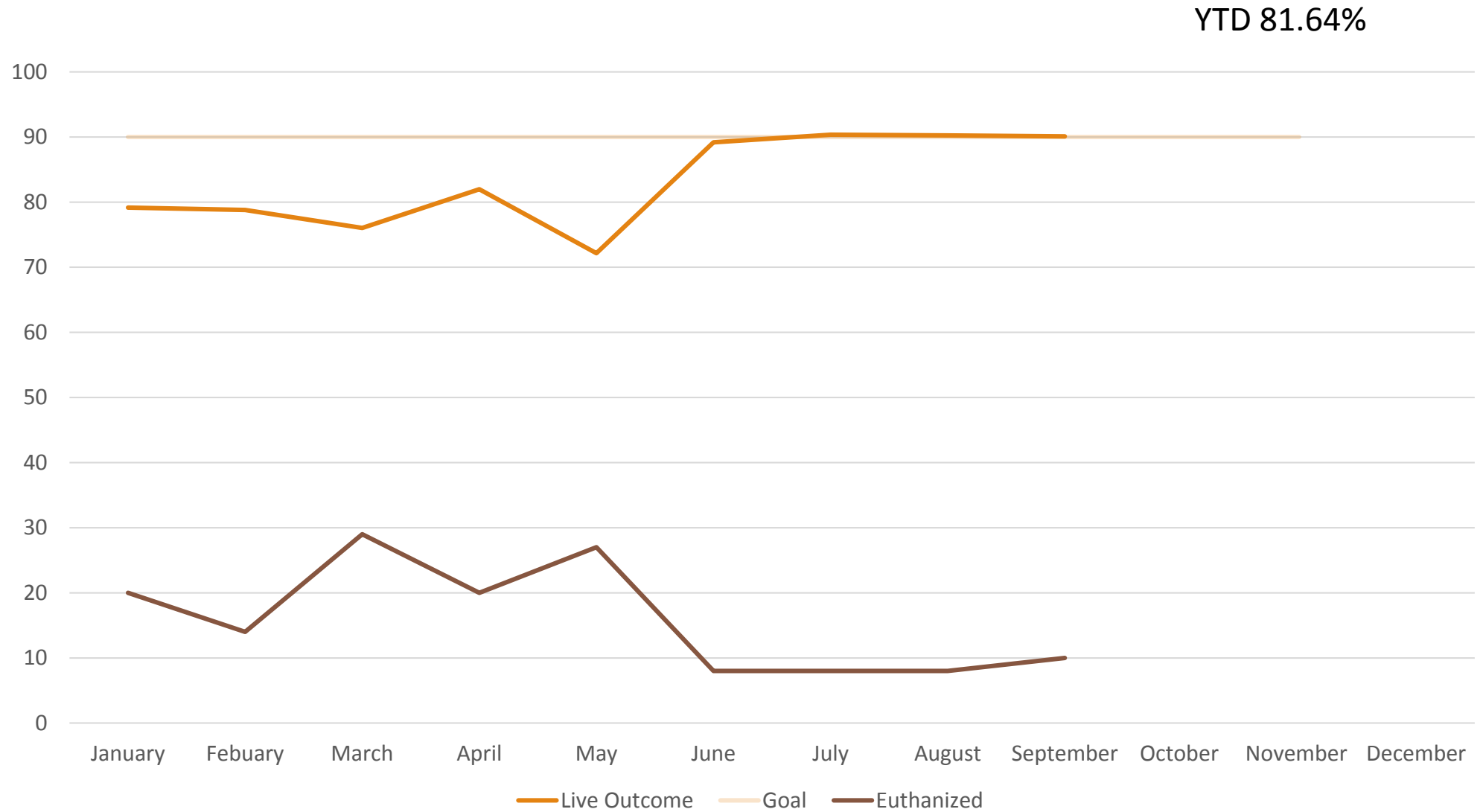

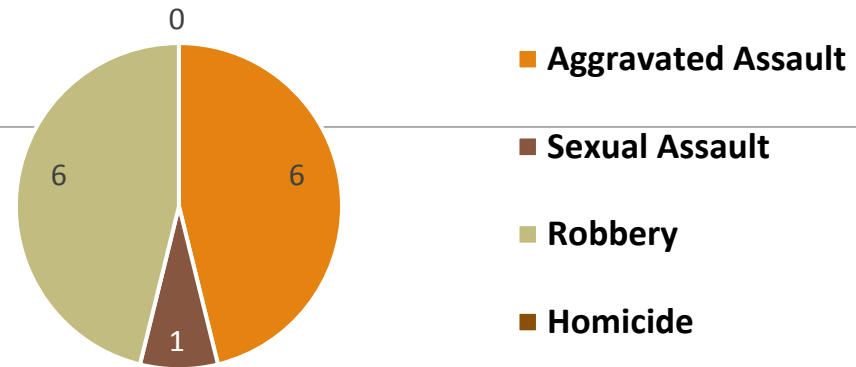

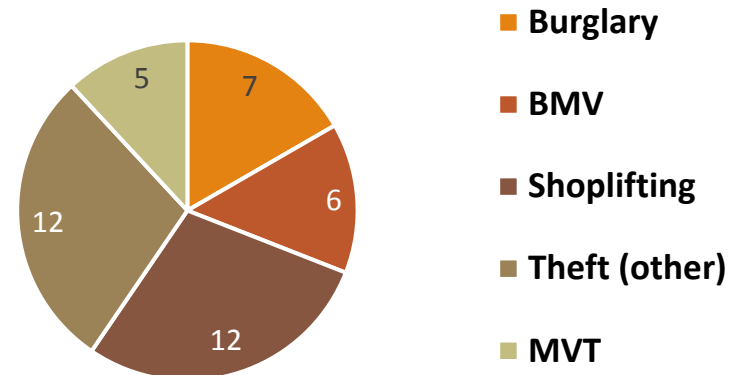

September 2018 Part 1: Person Crimes



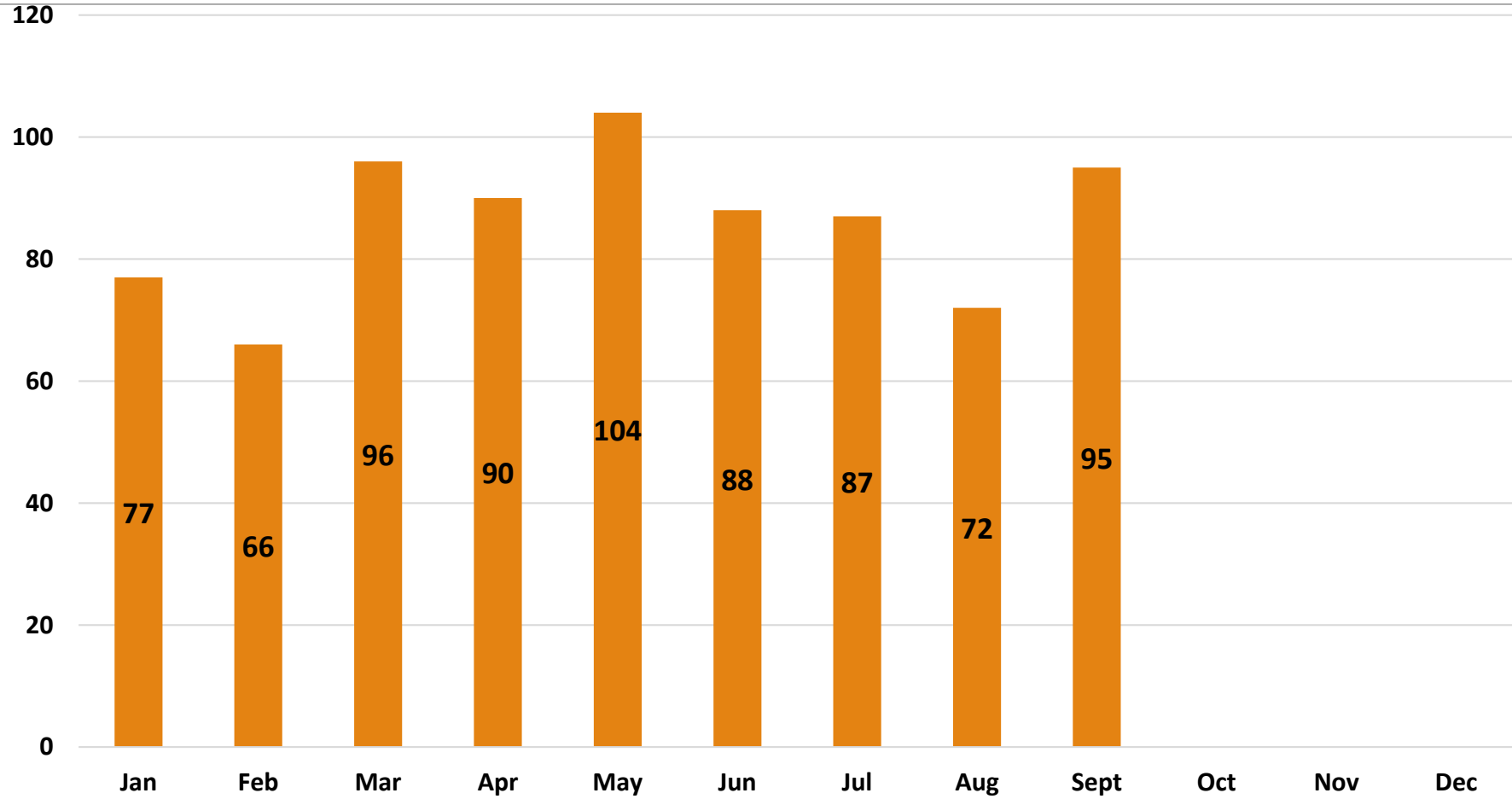
September 2018 Part 1: Property Crimes
