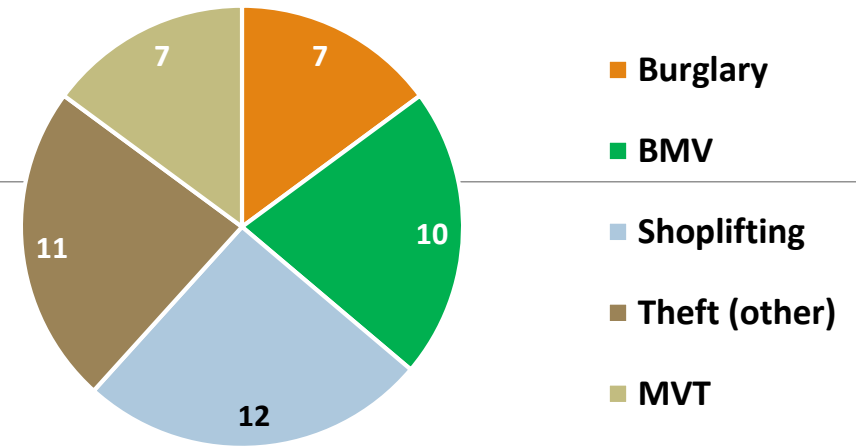

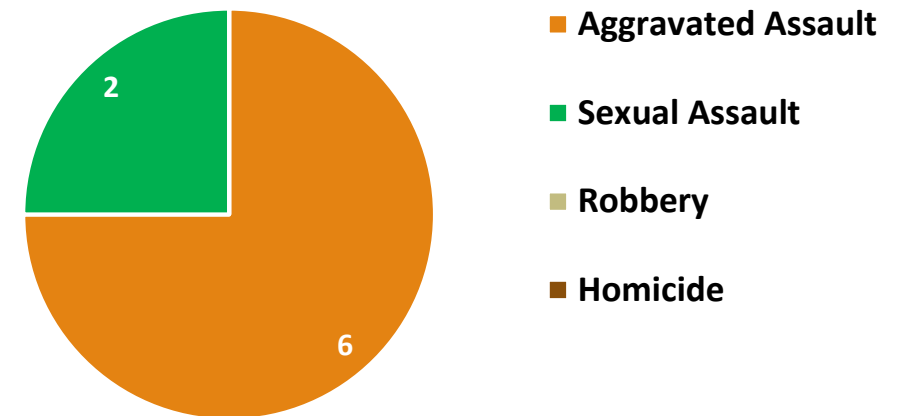

## November 2018 Part 1: Property Crimes



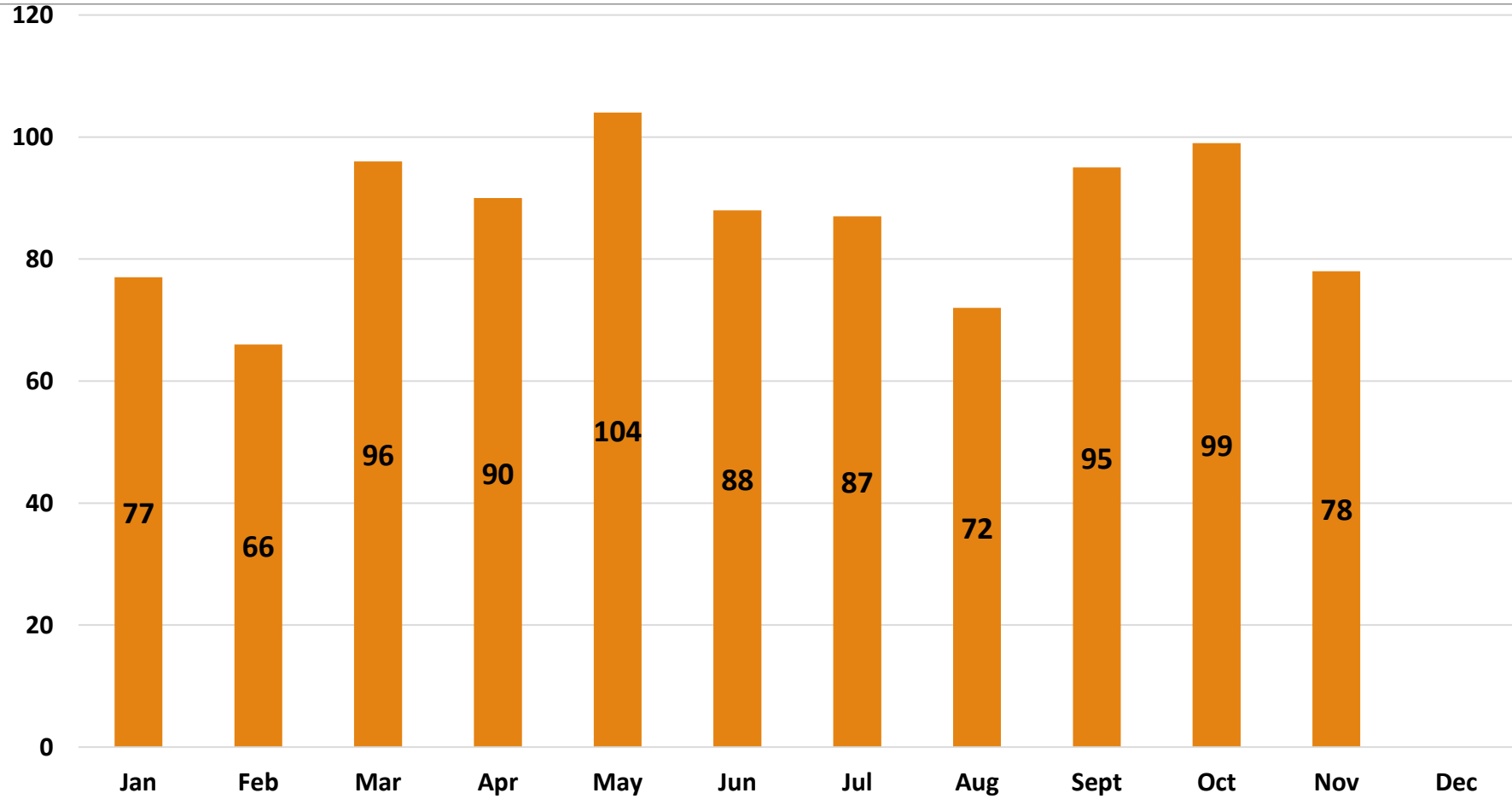
## November 2018 Part 1: Person Crimes
